The Whatcom County Council adopted the following at its May 21, 2024, meeting: ORDINANCE (2024-032) AMENDING THE PROJECT BUDGET FOR THE LAKE WHATCOM PARK TRAIL DEVELOPMENT meeting: OHDINANCE. [2024-032] AMENDING THE PROJECT BUDGET FOR THE LAKE WHATCOM PARK TRAIL DEVELOPMENT FUND, REQUEST NO. 3 (AB2024-303): This ordinance appropriates \$71,500 to fund completion of preliminary design and public outreach for Hertz Trailhead improvements at Lake Whatcom Park for a total project budget of \$1,029,525. This ordinance was introduced on May 7, 2024. ORDINANCE (2024-033) AMENDING THE 2024 WHATCOM COUNTY BUDGET, REQUEST NO. 7, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,605,662 (AB2024-302): This ordinance amends the 2024 Whatcom County budget as follows: From the General Fund: appropriate \$7,200 in Council to fund Enhanced Security Measures for Evening Meetings; appropriate \$15,500 in Parks to fund Hovander Park Irrigation System Upgrade Donation; appropriate \$7,200 in Sheriff to fund Enhanced Security Measures for Council Meetings overtime; appropriate \$16,630 in Superior Court to fund \$1h Superior Court dugle from grant proceeds; appropriate \$101,763 in Superior Court to fund Judicial Assistant for 5th Superior Court Judge from grant proceeds. From the Road Fund: appropriate \$100,000 to fund companion to Supplemental #4642 Ferry Operations. From the Parks Special Revenue Fund: appropriate \$15,500 to fund Hovander Park Irrigation System Upgrade companion to #4668. From the Community Priorities Fund: appropriate \$35,000 to fund companion to fund Historical Index Books & Misc. content. From the Real Estate Excise Tax II Fund: appropriate \$234,800 in Parks to fund Stimpson Family Nature Reserve Il Fund: appropriate \$234,800 in Parks to fund Stimpson Family Nature Reserve parking; appropriate \$265,000 in Parks to fund Bay Horizon Hostel Building demolition; appropriate \$71,500 in Parks to fund Lake Whatcom Trailhead Operating transfer; appropriate \$89,000 in Parks to fund Semiahmoo Sewer System Repair. From the Ferry Fund: appropriate \$160,000 in Public Works Administration to fund Dry Dock Passenger Ferry; record \$358,000 in Ferry & Docks to fund ARPA appropriation for Ferry Farebox loss. From the Equipment Rental and Revolving Fund: decrease appropriation of \$41,431 in Equipment Services to fund 2024 Mower Arm Purchases – Alamo. The ordinance also designates contributions from the Community Priorities Fund to the Ferry Fund in the amount of \$358,000, as detailed in supplemental budget request #4642, as 'Fare Box Considered Revenue' for purposes of calculating the Annual Fare Box Contribution defined in Whatcom County Code section 10.34.005(C) in response to losses suffered during the COVID pandemic. This ordinance was introduced on May 21, 2024.

ORDINANCE CLOSING THE VACTOR TRUCK STORAGE BUILDING FUND 379 (AB2024-333): This ordinance closes the Vactor Truck Storage Building Fund 379 and returns remaining funds of \$426,509,12 to the Road Fund. This ordinance was introduced on May 21, 2024. ORDINANCE CLOSING THE SOUTH FORK PARK IMPROVEMENT FUND 363 (AB2024-335): This ordinance closes the South Fork Park Improvement Fund 363 and returns remaining funds of \$32,382,95 to the REET II. Fund. This ordinance was introduced on May 21, 2024. 
