11	WHEREAS , Whatcom County recognizes broadband as an essential utility and critical infrastructure requiring significant public investment; and

27	WHEREAS, Whatcom County has invested millions of dollars in matching funds for		
28	high-priority Port and PUD broadband projects throughout rural Whatcom County; and

31	agreement (Contract #202304010) formalizing its partnership with the Port and PUD; and

33	WHEREAS, the interlocal agreement provides a framework to coordinate and		
34	collaborate, including the establishment of a joint broadband steering committee to facilitate

37	WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of Whatcom County to establish policy to		
38	coordinate the installation of utilities, including broadband telecommunications, during

42	WHEREAS, developing a framework for utility coordination helps streamline		
43	processes, increase efficiency, minimize excavation on roads, and reduce the cost of		
44	installing utilities; and

46	WHEREAS, this framework helps Whatcom County move forward in our collective		
47	efforts to increase access to quality and affordable broadband for all residents of Whatcom

WHEREAS, for the purpose of efficiency and providing clear policy guidance, this resolution aims to establish Council support for potential approaches that form a broadband access policy.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Whatcom County Council that the County Council and their staff will work cooperatively with the County Executive and their staff to develop proposals on the following topics for Council consideration and possible action as appropriate to improve access to broadband for all residents of Whatcom County:

1. A joint notification system to communicate and facilitate opportunities for the Port, PUD, and other public and private utility and telecommunications providers (including internet service providers) to install utility infrastructure, such as broadband conduit and/or fiber. Notification to all utility and telecommunications providers could be sent during all planned and permitted road construction projects and residential, commercial, and industrial development (in high-priority broadband areas) to allow for timely coordination and installation of utilities. The County's 'Stay Informed' list could be a tool to facilitate the notification.

2. A 'notification and coordination of construction activities' clause to be included in all new and renewed franchise agreements. For example, language may read:

Coordination of construction activities; Shared excavations
Grantee and the County shall each exercise reasonable efforts to coordinate any
construction work that either may undertake within the Right-of-Way so as to
promote the orderly and expeditious performance and completion of such work as
a whole. Grantee and the County shall further exercise reasonable efforts to
minimize any delay or hindrance to any construction work undertaken by the
Parties within the Right-of-Way.

3. A geographic information services (GIS) "Broadband Priority Map," partnering with the PUD and Port to develop a multilayered GIS map that can take inventory of current internet availability and identify high-priority areas where future installation or improvements to broadband service could be most reasonable and track where conduit and/or fiber were installed.

a. Partner with relevant parties such as the Broadband Steering Committee, internet service providers, and county staff to establish criteria to help guide and identify priority areas on the "Broadband Priority Map".
b. Use this map in tandem with the notification system to facilitate coordination of utility and telecommunications installation including coordinated trenching for

broadband/internet infrastructure during ground disturbance in the County Right of Way efficiently and cost-effectively.

4. The addition of broadband/internet infrastructure to any relevant permit review check

lists, effectively making broadband/internet a required utility as a condition of permit for

5. Coordination between contractors and utility and telecommunications providers to facilitate the installation of broadband/internet infrastructure for certain right-of-way construction projects, as identified by the "Broadband Priority Map" and criteria.
