Revised Recommendation for Ferry Replacement: **Hybrid 20 car**

- > Reduce to a 20 car diesel-electric (HYBRID)
- ➤ Maintain existing terminal dimensions
 - -Improve Lummi Island terminal side
 - -No modifications on Gooseberry side
- > Keep installation of passenger only float
- > Defer bathroom and parking lot upgrades on Lummi Island Side
- > Project likely will require other federal funding
- ➤ May be ineligible for RAISE Notification to MARAD pending

Benefits of Reduced Scope-Hybrid 20

- Hybrid vessel reduces emissions compared to Current Ferry Whatcom Chief
- Minimizes environmental impacts on marine ecosystems
- Achieves the maximum wait times identified in the adopted level of service for the ferry system
- Reduces fiscal burden by more than half, \$50M
- Increases vehicle capacity by 25% (from 16 to 20 cars)
- Provides redundancy and promotes reliable services
- Meets the expectations of the customers and community

- 2. Executive provide financing plan options to Council in December
- 3. Executive to attend WCFAC meeting January to engage with Ferry customers
