ACTION TAKEN

The Whatcom County Council adopted the following at its June 7, 2022 meeting: **ORDINANCE (2022-045) PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF A PROPOSITION TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF WHATCOM COUNTY AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY TO LIFT THE LIMIT ON REGULAR PROPERTY TAXES UNDER CHAPTER 84.55 RCW FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING FOR CHILDCARE, EARLY LEARNING PROGRAMS, AND INCREASED SUPPORT FOR VULNERABLE CHILDREN (AB2022-303)** This ordinance submits to the Whatcom County Auditor, for inclusion on the ballot in a special election to be held concurrently with the November 8, 2022, general election, a proposition to the qualified voters of the County to approve or reject a levy above the regular property tax limitations established in RCW 84.55.010 for the funding of childcare and early childhood programs to improve kindergarten readiness and funding for support of homeless and otherwise vulnerable children. The proposed levy lift authorized by this proposition would permit the County to increase its regular property tax levy by \$0.19 per \$1000 of assessed valuation for collection in 2023 (to a total regular tax levy of \$0.94 per \$1000 of assessed valuation) and to increase the levy thereafter as allowed by chapter 84.55 RCW to allow for the uninterrupted continuation of the levy lift for a total term of ten (10) years. Ordinance introduced March 24, 2022. **ORDINANCE (2022-046) AMENDING WHATCOM COUNTY CODE SECTION 3.08.095 (SMALL WORKS ROSTER CONTRACT AWARD PROCESS) TO UPDATE REQUIREMENTS FOR BIDS AND PROPOSALS (AB2022-280)** This ordinance amends Whatcom County Code Section 3.08.095 to establish procedures for acquiring services from non-profit organizations that reimburse their costs of providing services without requiring request for proposals. Ordinance introduced May 10, 2022. **ORDINANCE (2022-047) AMENDING THE 2022 WHATCOM COUNTY BUDGET, REQUEST NO. 8A, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,500,000 (AB2022-319)** This ordinance amends the 2022 Whatcom County Budget as follows: From the Conservation Futures Fund, appropriate \$1,500,000 to fund purchase of conservation easement for Stewart Mountain Community Forest property - Phase I. Ordinance introduced June 7, 2022. **ORDINANCE AMENDING THE SHALLOW SHORE CULVERT RELOCATION FUND, REQUEST NO. 1 (AB2022-327)** This ordinance appropriates an additional \$295,000 to fund the Shallow Shore Culvert Relocation project for a total budget of \$395,000. Ordinance introduced June 7, 2022. **ORDINANCE AMENDING THE 2022 WHATCOM COUNTY BUDGET, REQUEST NO. 9, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$15,838,261 (AB2022-329)** This ordinance amends the 2022 Whatcom County Budget as follows: From the General Fund: appropriate \$59,637 in Assessor to fund a new Chief Appraiser position; appropriate \$41,000 in Health to fund moving expenses; appropriate \$17,000 in Non Departmental to partially fund a Natural Resources Environmental Manager position; appropriate \$43,706 in Prosecuting Attorney to fund a new Records Assistant position; appropriate \$67,296 in Prosecuting Attorney to fund a new Investigator Supervisor position; appropriate \$2,500 in Sheriff to fund Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Force investigations from grant proceeds; appropriate \$10,236 in Sheriff to fund FN303 less-lethal projects. From the Road Fund: appropriate \$827,690 to fund a transfer in support of the North Lake Samish Road Bridge Replacement project budget amendment #1.; appropriate \$68,946 to fund a new accounting supervisor position and reclassification of an existing clerk position. From the Swift Creek Sediment Management Fund, appropriate \$440,000 to fund 2022 and 2023 Swift Creek maintenance. From the American Rescue Plan Act Fund, appropriate \$2,200,000 to fund acquisition of affordable housing properties. 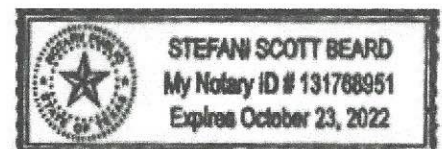
