Dana—As you know, the code simply requires, “The signatures of at least 60 percent of persons owning property within the proposed boundaries of the **zone** . . .” Therefore, I think you count every owner who signs, regardless if they own property jointly with their spouse or someone else. If they don’t sign, they don’t count. In addition, I don’t believe that the code language allows you to count an owner more than once, even if he or she owns more than one parcel. Easement owners are not property owners so they do not count. Maybe this lack of clarity needs to be fixed through an amendment? I don’t know if the current language always results in a fair result. Hello, Karen:

We have received a petition to form a no-shooting zone in the North Star Road area of the County. Jennifer and I are working on verifying that at least 60 percent of the people owning property within the boundaries of the proposed zone have signed the petition.

We have a list of all parcels and who owns them, but are not quite sure how to figure out the 60 percent. Here have the following questions:

*Married/joint owners – Do they count as two owners?*

*If only one of the married couple signs does that cover both?*

*If owner signs and only puts address of one of three properties that are within the zone?*

*If the same owner owns 3 parcels within zone is that counted as if it were three different owners or one owner?*

*Do owners of small easements count towards the 60%?*
