7	AMENDING WCC 2.145, LUMMI ISLAND FERRY ADVISORY COMMITTEE
8	WHEREAC Whateam County formed the Lunami Island Form, Advisory Committee
9 10	WHEREAS, Whatcom County formed the Lummi Island Ferry Advisory Committee (LIFAC) in 2012 to provide review and recommendations to the Whatcom County Council
11	and Executive on issues that affect the ongoing operations and infrastructure of ferry
12	service to Lummi Island and to provide a forum for those who depend upon Lummi Island
13	ferry service to voice their ideas and concerns about the ferry service; and
14	
15 16	WHEREAS, compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act (OPMA) and Public Records Act (PRA) requires certain administrative functions for the County's citizen advisory
17	committees, such as, but not limited to, holding open public meetings at public meeting
18	venues on Lummi Island and communicating its agendas and minutes to the community on
19	the County website; and
20	
21 22	WHEREAS, most County boards, commissions, and advisory committees comprised of volunteer citizens have County or other public agency staff assigned to provide some
22	level of administrative support and a public meeting location; and
24	level of administrative support and a public meeting location, and
25	WHEREAS, reservation and use of non-County owned meeting venue(s) on Lummi
26	Island requires funding and entering into an agreement for use of the venue, which
27	volunteer citizen advisory committee members are not authorized to commit to on behalf of
28 29	the County; and
30	WHEREAS, the County Public Works Department provides technical support to the
31	LIFAC on ferry-related issues, and attends most or all LIFAC meetings, but LIFAC does not
32	have a basic level of administrative support to comply with OPMA and PRA requirements;

34 35	WHEREAS, providing remote meeting access would benefit community members
36	who don't live on the Island, Islanders who can't attend meetings in person, and County
37	staff who attend LIFAC meetings but don't live on Lummi Island.

4	sources, and other major capital and operational issues regarding ferry service to Lummi Island.
5	B. The committee may advise the county council or the executive by developing recommendations that
6	are approved by a majority of the committee as defined in 2.145.050(E).
7	
8	C. If a recommendation is approved by less than a unanimous vote, one or more members may submit a
9	dissenting statement with the recommendations.
10	
11	D. The county council and the county executive may consider the committee's recommendations and
12	advice when making ferry-related decisions. The county council and/or county executive will make the
13	final decisions on all ferry-related matters. (Ord. 2012-005 Exh. A).

16	2.145.040 Membership – Term of office.
17	A. The committee shall consist of seven nine voting members, with at least four but no more than five of
18	them residents or property owners on Lummi Island. A quorum shall consist of at least half of the
19	appointed members.
20	 5 members who live on the island,
21	 2 members who live in unincorporated Whatcom County,
22	 2 members who live anywhere on the mainland (incorporated or unincorporated)
23	 Priority given to one Lummi Nation representative when possible
24	 1 County Councilmember will be an ad hoc non-voting member
25	
26	B. The county council shall appoint the committee members. Member terms will be three years;
27	provided, that the terms of members first appointed will be staggered so that three of the committee
28	members shall be appointed for two years. Members of the committee shall serve without
29	compensation. (Ord. 2012-005 Exh. A).
30	
31	2.145.050 Organization – Meetings.
32	A. Meetings of the committee shall be open and accessible to the public and shall be subject to the
33	Open Public Meetings Act. There will be a good faith effort to host meetings both on and off island.
34	
35	BAt every meeting, the committee will schedule an open session to take public comment on ferry
36	issues. A public comment session will be scheduled at all regular meetings. Public Comment is not
37	required at special meetings. Public comment can be provided orally at a regular meeting or in writing
38	prior to or at a regular meeting
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1	C. Written records of meetings, resolutions, research, findings and recommendations shall be kept and
2	such records shall be submitted to county council staff and shall be made public, including posting on
3	the county website.
4	
5	D. The committee shall adopt its own rules and procedures for the conduct of business, except the
6	number of members required for a quorum to meet and take action.
7	
8	E. The number of members required for a quorum in order to meet and take action is five voting
9	members, which is a majority of all positions regardless of whether or not any positions are vacant.
10	
11 12	<u>F.</u> The committee shall elect a chairperson from among its members who shall preside at its meetings.
13	FG. The committee shall annually, at the first meeting in January, review the most current County
14	Council and County Executive Expectations for Boards and Commissions. The most current version will
15	be posted on the committee website.
16	
17	H. The committee shall determine its meeting schedule and agenda, but shall meet at least quarterly.
18	
19	GI. The committee may form and appoint ad hoc committees to work on specific issues, so long as at
20	least two committee members are also members of each ad hoc committee.
21	
22	HJ. The committee shall comply with Chapter 2.03 WCC, Boards and Commissions. (Ord. 2012-005 Exh.
23	A).

25	2.145.055 Membership – Rules of Procedure and Conduct.
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27	A. All members shall be trained on and comply with the Open Public Meetings Act, and training shall be
28	done and updated per the State Open Government Training Act and RCW 42.30.205. 25
29	
30	B. All members shall comply with the most current version of the County Council and County Executive
31	Expectations for Boards and Commissions.
32	
33	2.145.060 Committee staffing.
34	The committee is encouraged to operate and hold its meetings as independent of county staffing and
35	resources as possible, including but not limited to developing its own agendas and minutes.
36	
37	Ongoing administrative support to the committee shall be provided by the county Public Works
38	Department to ensure the committee complies with County Code requirements, the Open Public
39	Meetings Act (OPMA), and the Public Records Act, including but not limited to:
40	

1 A. entering into agreements for and paying the cost of meeting rental venues 2 3 B. ensuring meeting agendas and minutes and other required meeting information are posted to the 4 County website per OPMA and County Code requirements 5 6 C. responding to public records requests and maintaining committee's records 7 8 Additional Sstaffing and other resources for the committee shall be requested through the county 9 executive's office. 10 All staff time and county resources expended in support of the committee, including meeting venue 11 12 rental fees and costs for providing remote meeting access, will be considered ferry operation expenses. 13 The committee is authorized to request from the executive's office information from administrative 14 departments as necessary.
