From the Road Fund, appropriate \$13,950 in Public Works to fund road contribution for new Lurmi Island Terminal spring lines completion supplemental #4803 and longer gangway for ADA compliance companion to supplemental #4804 ferry expenses; appropriate \$20,000 in Public Works to fund contribution for the Central Shop NPDES Stormwater Improvements Project fund amendment no. 1 companion to supplemental #4808. From the Elections Fund, appropriate \$40,000 to fund OS25 Information security grant from the Washington Secretary of State. From the Jail Fund, appropriate \$150,000 in Corrections to fund H2A Medicaid Laundry Project with grant proceeds; appropriate \$6,473 in Corrections to fund Header Measure Work with grant proceeds. From the Public Utilities Fund, appropriate \$700,000 to fund Habitat for Humanity project land acquisition. From the Ferry Fund, appropriate \$16,000 in Public Works to fund new Lurmi Island Terminal spring lines; appropriate \$15,000 in Public Works to fund longer gangway during dry docks for ADA compliance. ORDINANCE (2024-070) AMENDING THE PROJECT BUDGET FOR THE INTEGRATED LAND RECORDS AND PERMIT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM FUND, REQUEST NO. 3 (AB2024-752); This ordinance appropriates \$250,000 to fund phase II of the permit system project for a total project budget of \$3,206,661. This ordinance was introduced on November 19, 2024.

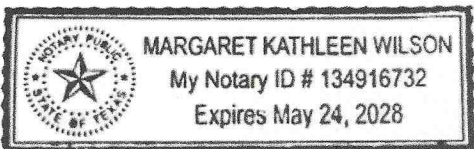
