# Closure of SR 542/Mount Baker Highway east of Bellingham begins after Memorial Day weekend

## *Highway will close between Britton and Noon roads for fish passage project*

BELLINGHAM – Local residents and tourists who use State Route 542/Mount Baker Highway should prepare for a summer-long closure of the highway between Britton Road and Noon Road beginning Tuesday, May 30 for up to 105 days. During the closure, contractor crews working for the Washington State Department of Transportation will build a new bridge for the [Squalicum Creek to Bellingham Bay fish passage project](#).

Crews will remove the current fish barrier and replace it with a single-span 105-foot-long bridge that allows native species of fish to access upstream habitat.

### **What can travelers expect?**

Building a new bridge requires closing all lanes of SR 542/Mount Baker Highway. Detours will be:

- Eastbound on SR 542 via north on Hannegan Road to East Smith Road to SR 542.
- Westbound on SR 542 via East Smith Road, south on Hannegan Road and back to SR 542/Sunset Drive.

To help deter travelers from bypassing the detour, there are additional closures at the following intersections:

- Kelly Road and Hannegan Road
- Van Wyck Road and Hanegan Road
- Van Wyck Road and Noon Road

Travelers also will see the speed limit reduced to 35 mph on Hannegan Road as well as a temporary traffic signal at the intersection of East Smith and Everson Goshen roads.

### **Project will increase access to fish habitat**

Squalicum Creek is a tributary of Bellingham Bay located 2.5 miles east of the Nooksack River delta. It primarily supports pink, chum and coho salmon as well as resident and sea-run cutthroat trout. Removing the existing barrier will provide about 3 additional miles of habitat.
