1. <u>AB2022-159</u> Discussion and update on the progress and next steps for the Justice Project (Public Health, Safety, and Justice Facility Needs Assessment)

Buchanan and Tyler Schroeder, Executive's Office, presented on the history, recent developments, plans, and financial considerations.

Bill Elfo, Sheriff, spoke about immediate issues and measures they are currently using or looking at to ease some of the pressure on the jail right now.

Satpal Sidhu, County Executive, stated he did not have anything to add to the presentation but he answered questions.

The speakers answered how much pressure it would take off the jail if the deal happens with the City of Billingham to take felons to Snohomish County, what was the most number of people the County was able to take to Yakima County and why that option ended, whether other jurisdictions out-bid us for Yakima's spaces, when a new facility would open if it was approved by the voters, what the projected cost was to build the proposed facility when they went out to the voters in 2015, what a sales tax amount would need to be now, whether they are also exploring other ways to fund the jail other than a .2 percent sales tax, and what the projected timeline is for the work of the Justice Project to be done.
