#### **ACTION TAKEN**

The Whatcom County Council adopted the following at its September 24, 2024, meeting: ORDINANCE (2024-046) ADOPTING VARIOUS AMENDMENTS TO WHATCOM COUNTY CODE TITLE 20, ZONING (AB2024-545): This ordinance amends Whatcom County Code Title 20, Zoning, to clarify code, fix inconsistencies and grammar, and modify or add minor policies, including one proposed policy change to allow cannabis retail in the Light Impact Industrial District within Urban Growth Areas. This ordinance was introduced on September 10, 2024. ORDINANCE (2024-047) ADOPTING THE 2020 SHORELINE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM PERIODIC UPDATE (AB2024-559): This ordinance adopts the 2020 Shoreline Management Program, including amendments to the Whatcom County Comprehensive Plan (Chapter 8 Resource Lands, Chapter 10 Environment, and Chapter 11 Shorelines) and Whatcom County Code Titles 22 (Land Use & Development) and 23 (Shoreline Management Regulations), and Whatcom County Code Chapter 16.16 (Critical Areas). This ordinance was introduced on September 10, 2024. RESOLUTION (2024-038) ADOPTING THE 2025-2030 SIX-YEAR WATER RESOURCES IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (WRIP) BY THE WHATCOM COUNTY COUNCIL (COUNCIL ACTING AS THE WHATCOM COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL ZONE DISTRICT BOARD OF SUPERVISORS) (AB2024-564): This resolution by the Whatcom County Flood Control Zone District Board of Supervisors adopts the Six-Year Water Resources Improvement Program (WRIP) for 2025-2030 pursuant to RCW 86.15.110. This resolution was introduced on September 10, 2024. RESOLUTION (2024-040) APPROVING THE 2025-2030 SIX-YEAR TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (STIP) (AB2024-579): This resolution approves the 2025-2030 Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) including capital elements of the first six-years of the Fourteen-Year Ferry Capital Program. ORDINANCE (2024-052) ESTABLISHING WHATCOM COUNTY CODE CHAPTER 2.180 NAMING COUNTY-OWNED PUBLIC BUILDINGS, PROPERTIES, PARKS, AND FACILITIES (AB2024-314): This ordinance establishes Whatcom County Code 2.180 Naming County-owned public buildings, properties, and facilities, which provides a process and criteria for the naming and renaming of Whatcom County-owned public buildings, properties, and facilities. ordinance adopts the 2020 Shoreline Management Program, including amendments to the Whatcom County Comprehenestablishes with a control of the naming and renaming of Whatcom County-owned public buildings, properties, and facilities. RESOLUTION (2024-039) AMENDING THE 2024 FLOOD CONTROL ZONE DISTRICT AND SUBZONES BUDGET, REQUEST NO.5, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$257,550 (COUNCIL ACTING AS THE WHATCOM COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL ZONE DISTRICT BOARD OF SUPERVISORS) (AB2024-602): This resolution amends the 2024 Flood Control Zone District and Subzones Budget, appropriating \$7,550 from Samish Warshad Subzones to Appropriating \$7,550 from Samish Warshad Subzones in Jahor costs and appropriating \$7,500 from Natural Programment of the Program tershed Subzone to Maintenance & Operation due to an increase in labor costs and appropriating \$250,000 from Natural Resources to Maintenance and Operation via DOE grants for Adjudication technical assistance and Ecology collaboration for a net balance of \$7,550. This resolution was introduced on September 10, 2024.
