COUNCIL ACTION TAKEN

The Whatcom County Council adopted the following at its July 23, 2019, meeting: **ORDINANCE (2019-057) AMENDING WHATCOM COUNTY CODE (WCC) TITLE 20 (CHAPTERS 20.51 AND 20.71) PERTAINING TO TREE REMOVAL PERMIT PROCEDURES AND TITLE 23 (CHAPTER 23.10) UPDATING THE REFERENCED CRITICAL AREAS ORDINANCE (AB2019-316):** This ordinance amends WCC to clarify what type of permit is needed to remove trees within the Lake Whatcom Watershed and the Water Resource Protection overlay districts (Lake Padden, Samish, and Whatcom watersheds) in order to monitor tree canopy retention through the requirement to apply for a tree removal permit. It also amends the Shoreline Master Program (SMP) to adopt the recently amended Critical Areas Ordinance (CAO) regarding the definition of "hazard tree" and directs Planning & Development Services (PDS) to submit it to the Department of Ecology for their review and approval. This ordinance was introduced June 18, 2019.

ORDINANCE (2019-053) AMENDING WHATCOM COUNTY CODE 16.30 ENTITLED "LAKE WHATCOM STORMWATER UTILITY FUNDING MECHANISM" (2019-377): This ordinance creates a funding mechanism for the Lake Whatcom Stormwater Utility Service Area, effective January 1, 2020. The following annual rates are established for the area for the year 2020: Small single family residential footprint (parcel containing a single-family residence with less than or equal to 2,500 impervious square feet) - \$55.32; medium single family residential footprint (parcel containing a single-family residence with more than 2,500 impervious square feet and less than or equal to 8,400 impervious square feet) - \$73.76; large single family residential footprint (parcel containing a single-family residence with more than 8,400 impervious square feet) - \$147.52; other developed parcels - \$73.76 per equivalent service unit (a configuration of impervious surface estimated to contribute an amount of runoff to the County's stormwater management system which is approximately equal to that created by the average single-family residential developed parcel in the service area). The following annual rates are established for the Service Area for the year 2021: Small single family residential footprint (parcel containing a single-family residence with less than or equal to 2,500 impervious square feet) - \$110.64; medium single family residential footprint (parcel containing a single-family residence with more than 2,500 impervious square feet and less than or equal to 8,400 impervious square feet) - \$147.52; large single family residential footprint (parcel containing a single-family residence with more than 8,400 impervious square feet) - \$295.04; other developed parcels - \$147.52 per equivalent service unit (a configuration of impervious surface estimated to contribute an amount of runoff to the County's stormwater management system which is approximately equal to that created by the average single-family residential developed parcel in the service area). A capital facilities charge is established for new development or expansion or densification of existing development as follows: Single family parcels - \$1,730 per parcel; other developed parcels - \$1,730 per equivalent service unit. This ordinance was introduced July 9, 2019.

ORDINANCE (2019-052) GRANTING NORTHWEST WATER ASSOCIATION A FRANCHISE AND THE RIGHT, PRIVILEGE, AND AUTHORITY THEREUNDER TO LOCATE, SET, ERECT, LAY, CONSTRUCT, EXTEND, SUPPORT, ATTACH, CONNECT, MAINTAIN, REPAIR, REPLACE, ENLARGE, OPERATE AND USE FACILITIES IN, UPON, ALONG, ACROSS AND THROUGH THE FRANCHISE AREA TO ALLOW FOR THE PROVISION OF WATER SERVICES (2019-347): This ordinance grants a 25 year non-exclusive franchise to construct, erect, alter, lay, support, connect, improve, renew, replace, repair, operate and maintain water transmission and distribution facilities upon, under, over across and along certain roads and other areas in Whatcom County. The "Franchise Area" is legally described as follows: all public county roads, county public ways, and county property now owned or hereafter dedicated to the County with Sections 33, 34, and 35, Township 39 North, Range 2 East of W.M., and Sections 2 and 3, Township 38 North, Range 2 East of W.M. in Whatcom County, Washington as may hereafter be amended and attached hereto. In addition, any portion of Smith Road, Northwest Drive, Waslike Road, Aldrich Road, Slater Road, and Pacific

This ordinance was introduced June 18, 2019. **ORDINANCE (2019-054) AMENDING THE PROJECT BASED BUDGET FOR THE AGATE HEIGHTS/ESTATE BAY LANE STORM WATER IMPROVEMENTS FUND, REQUEST NO. 3 (AB2019-376):** This ordinance adds \$360,000 of expenditure authority to the project budget of \$1,308,219, for a total amended project budget of \$1,668,219. This ordinance was introduced July 9, 2019. **ORDINANCE (2019-055) AMENDING THE 2019 WHATCOM COUNTY BUDGET, REQUEST NO. 9 (AB2019-378):** This ordinance adds appropriations to District Court Probation - \$120,000; Non-Departmental - \$129,122; Sheriff - \$5,000; Stormwater Fund - \$28,000, for a total supplemental amount of \$282,122. This ordinance was introduced July 9, 2019. **ORDINANCE (2019-056) AMENDING WHATCOM COUNTY CODE 2.46.020 AND 2.46.030 TO AMEND THE WHATCOM COUNTY INCARCERATION PREVENTION AND REDUCTION TASK FORCE PURPOSE AND FUNCTION (AB2019-389):** This ordinance expands the purpose and function of the Incarceration Prevention and Reduction Task Force (purpose and function) related to prevention, intervention, treatment, and aftercare. This ordinance was introduced July 9, 2019. **RESOLUTION (2019-033) AMENDING THE WHATCOM COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT SUBZONES BUDGET, REQUEST NO. 4 (COUNCIL ACTING AS THE WHATCOM COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL ZONE DISTRICT BOARD OF SUPERVISORS) (AB2019-380):** This ordinance adds appropriations to the Storm Water Fund - \$28,000; Birch Bay Watershed & Aquatic Resources Management District - \$190,000, for a total supplemental amount of \$218,000. This ordinance was introduced July 9, 2019. **ORDINANCE (2019-058) AMENDING WHATCOM COUNTY CHARTER SECTIONS 4.20 (QUALIFICATIONS) AND 6.90 (ILLEGAL CONTRACTS) (AB2019-322):** This ordinance amends language in the Charter to replace most or obsolete references (her or his). This ordinance was introduced June 4, 2019.
