Byrd stated he requested in committee that he get together with the stakeholders and Planning and Development Services staff then come back to the committee with a version that may resolve the questions they have had.

Dana Brown-Davis, Clerk of the Council, answered whether the discussion could just be held in Committee but stated the related Ordinance should be pulled from Introduction.

Donovan moved that **AB2021-606** (Ordinance adopting amendments to the Whatcom County Code Title 20, Zoning, to provide additional affordable housing options, including allowing and regulating tiny homes and allowing duplexes in planned unit developments) be withdrawn from introduction. The motion was seconded by Elenbaas.




