RE: **Contract for Services with Associated Earth Sciences, Inc.**

Requested Action

Public Works respectfully requests that the County Executive, and the County Council, acting as the Flood Control Zone District Board of Supervisors, enter into an agreement between the Whatcom County Flood Control Zone District and Associated Earth Sciences, Inc. to conduct Phase 1 of an investigation into the impacts of agricultural tile drains on stream flows.

Background and Purpose

The Water Resources Inventory Area (WRIA) 1 Watershed Management Board recently completed the development of the Whatcom Groundwater Model. This model is being used to investigate different water management strategies. One strategy that is being investigated is modifying current agricultural tile drain management techniques to improve summer instream flows while allowing agricultural production to continue. This scenario was modeled using the Whatcom Groundwater Model. A field investigation of tile drain management techniques is needed to verify the modeling results and further determine if this strategy may be feasible to address water management issues. This work is being conducted in coordination with the Whatcom Groundwater Model Team, an ad hoc committee of the WRIA 1 Watershed Staff Team, that is working to cooperatively address regional water supply challenges. Member agencies include Whatcom County, Public Utility District No. 1 of Whatcom County, Lummi Nation, Nooksack Indian Tribe, City of Bellingham, Washington Department of Ecology, and the Ag Water Board.

Funding Amount and Source

This contract in the amount of \$108,863.00, is fully funded through a grant from the Washington Department of Ecology. The FCZD has adequate budget authority in the 2024 budget for this contract.
