Whatcom County Public Works (WCPW) respectfully requests that the County Executive and the County Council enter into an interlocal agreement with the City of Bellingham to fund Aquatic Invasive Species enforcement patrols on Lake Whatcom and Lake Samish.

Background and Purpose

The Lake Whatcom Management Program (LWMP) launched the Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Prevention Program in 2012 with the goal of preventing the introduction of zebra and quagga mussels and other aquatic invasive species to Lake Whatcom. Whatcom County works with LWMP partners City of Bellingham and Lake Whatcom Water and Sewer District to support the AIS program, which focuses on mandatory boat inspections at Lake Whatcom and Lake Samish and educating the boating public about AIS prevention.

The project partners believe it is beneficial to the program to conduct enforcement patrols. In 2020, the City of Bellingham piloted a program to provide AIS regulations enforcement on Lake Whatcom and Lake Samish via an interlocal agreement with the Whatcom County Sheriff's Office (WCSO). Whatcom County will continue this program onwards through interdepartmental agreements between WCPW and WCSO. This interlocal agreement brings in the City of Bellingham to fund 50% of the AIS enforcement patrols expenses, which include staff and fuel costs. Whatcom County Council approved \$40,000 of expenditures for AIS enforcement patrols in the 2023 budget, as detailed in ASR # 2023-6441. The same amount will be included in the 2024 budget.

Funding Amount and Source

This agreement will reimburse Whatcom County for 50% of the AIS enforcement patrols cost, not to exceed \$20,000 per year for the first two years.

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN WHATCOM COUNTY AND THE CITY OF BELLINGHAM FOR AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES ENFORCEMENT PATROLS

WHEREAS, the City of Bellingham (City) and Whatcom County (County) have a mutual interest in protecting water resources in the Lake Whatcom and Lake Samish Watersheds; and

WHEREAS, Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) are capable of impacting water quality, recreational use, public and private water supply systems, and the aquatic ecology of Lake Whatcom and Lake Samish; and

WHEREAS, the City and the County have committed resources to addressing AIS issues in Lake Whatcom and Lake Samish; and

WHEREAS, the City and the County each have agreed to incur separate AIS program costs that are not included in this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the County Public Works Department and Sheriff's Office have an interdepartmental agreement in place for providing AIS enforcement patrols; and

WHEREAS, a coordinated effort, including a sharing of some program costs, is needed to prevent the introduction of AIS into Lake Whatcom and Lake Samish.

NOW, THEREFORE, Whatcom County and the City of Bellingham agree as follows:

1. SCOPE OF WORK

The County will implement AIS enforcement patrols as detailed in the Interdepartmental Agreement for Aquatic Invasive Species Enforcement Patrols Between Whatcom County Public Works and Whatcom County Sheriff's Office- 2023 (Exhibit A).

2. TERM

(a) Notwithstanding the date of signature hereof, this Agreement shall be effective June 1, 2023 and shall be automatically renewed unless cancelled in writing by either party within 60 days of its anniversary date.

- (b) This Agreement may be terminated for convenience by either party after the giving of ninety (90) days written notice to the other party whereupon payment for time and effort expended up to and including the date of termination shall be paid in full.
- (c) This agreement may be terminated for cause by either party after giving the defaulting party thirty (30) days written notice of default and an opportunity to cure.

3. PAYMENT

- (a) As compensation for the services specified in the Exhibit A, the City shall reimburse the County for fifty (50) percent of the actual labor, equipment, and material expenses incurred for the AIS enforcement patrols, up to \$20,000 per year in 2023 and 2024. In recognition of the ongoing increases in program costs (notably in the cost of labor and benefits), the parties agree to add an annual 3% inflationary factor to the maximum amount after 2024. The maximum yearly amount may not exceed this unless agreed to in writing by each party.
- (b) Payments to the County will be made annually based on invoices submitted to the City.
- (c) The City shall promptly review and process invoices in accordance with its usual procedures.
- (d) A short program update shall accompany each invoice.

4. PERSONS RESPONSIBLE FOR ADMINISTRATION OF THE AGREEMENT

5. LEGAL RELATIONS

In performing the services outlined in this Agreement, neither party is acting as the agent or employee of the other; rather, each party is acting as an independent contractor. Each party agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless as to all claims for damages arising out of activities it undertakes arising out of this Agreement.

6. LIABILITY

The City agrees to release, defend and indemnify the County from any claims, damages or liabilities arising out of the acts or omissions of the City, its staff members and its

contractors in the performance of this Agreement. Likewise, the County agrees to defend and indemnify the City from any claims, damages or liabilities arising out of the acts or omissions of the County, its staff members and its contractors in the performance of this Agreement.

7. MODIFICATIONS

The terms of this Agreement may be changed, modified, amended or waived only by written agreement executed by the Parties hereto. Waiver or breach of any term or condition of this Agreement shall not be considered a waiver of any prior or subsequent breach.

8. APPLICABLE LAW

In the performance of this Agreement, it is mutually understood and agreed upon by the Parties hereto that this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Washington, both as to interpretation and performance, and the venue of any action arising herefrom shall be in the Superior Court of the State of Washington in and for Whatcom County.

9. SEVERABILITY

In the event any term or condition of this Agreement or application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other terms, conditions, or applications of this Agreement that can be given effect without the invalid term, condition, or application. To this end the terms and conditions of this Agreement are declared severable.

10. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement contains all the terms and conditions agreed upon by the Parties. All items incorporated herein by reference are attached. No other understandings, oral or otherwise, regarding the subject matter of this Agreement shall be deemed to exist or to bind any of the Parties hereto.
