10 Kyann Flint stated anyone has the potential for becoming a member of the disabled
11 community, and the contract needs to involve the disabled community throughout the
12 process.
13

14 Daman Wandke, AbiliTrek, stated the public input allowed in the contract is minimal.
15 There needs to be more input on the plan before it is published.
16

17 James Christianson stated the contractor seems knowledgeable about ADA issues.
18 Pedestrians need more visual cues at pedestrian-activated light crossings.
19

20 Candice Styer stated features that people think make the environment accessible
21 may not actually do so. There needs to be more consideration of and planning around
22 barriers. Recruit as many people with disabilities as possible to participate in the process.
23

24 Bob Burr stated the County needs to hire a researcher who can engage in research
25 and write plans on County issues rather than hire a contractor.
26

27 Mark Challendar stated he is a member of the County's ADA Advisory Committee and
28 worked with staff when interviewing consultants. He described the scope of the contract
29 and answered questions about the required qualifications of the contractor.
30

31 Harley Draven spoke about her volunteer work as an ADA advocate. More people in
32 the community need to be involved.
33

34 Ashanti Monts-Tréviska stated there isn't enough support for the disabled
35 community. There needs to be better visual cues in traffic, bus lines, and bicycle lanes.
36

37 Hearing no one else, Browne closed the public hearing.
38

39 Jon Hutchings, Public Works Department Director, gave a staff report and introduced
40 members of the Public Works staff team who will be working on the project. They will
41 create an open and inclusive process to develop ADA infrastructure.

44 happening with the City of Bellingham and required qualifications for someone to do this
45 work.
