

Qualifications-Based Selection

As it Applies to Local Businesses

What We Can Ask for:

Demonstrated Experience & Success in Local Business Engagement

- "Describe your experience in developing outreach plans to local, small, women/minority/veteran-owned businesses (LSWMVOBs) and provide examples of past success."
- "Provide examples of utilizing LSWMVOBs to increase project value during preconstruction."
- "Provide examples of mentoring LSWMVOBs and helping these firms grow and succeed."

What We Can Ask for in the Request for Proposal (RFP) Stage:

Project-Specific Commitments & Plans

- "Provide your outreach plan for engaging LSWMVOBs for this project."
- "Describe how you will mentor LSWMVOBs throughout the project."
- "Detail how you will meet the priority hire goals for this project."

What We Cannot Ask for:

Location-Based Preferences

 We cannot award points or percentages based on contractor location, as it is not a qualification required for performing the work.

Risks to Avoid:

Legal & Competitive Risks


- Risk of favoritism or unfair competition All bidders must have the same opportunity.
- Risk of cost escalation Restrictions that limit competition or elevate project costs are not allowed.

Funding & Regulatory Risks

- Risk to federal funding Local preference policies can jeopardize federal funding eligibility.
- Risk of non-compliance State and federal laws prohibit selection criteria that restrict full and fair competition.
