Drop-In Child Care

- Contract Executed: 01/29/25
- Contract Expires: 4/30/26
- 3 enrolled providers (98225 & 98230)
- More providers coming onboard in May in Ferndale, Deming and Nooksack
- 122 spaces per month
- 100% usage for qualifying families
- Next steps: child care provider and family recruitment

What community resources and activities would you like to see more of in your area?

"Low-cost drop-off child care for situations where parents need to attend to things without child care duties. It can be challenging to take care of some needs because so much of my time is spent either at work or caring for children and there are very few alternatives/supports for occasions when I need to be apart from them." - Parent in Bellingham



What are the biggest challenges and concerns for you and your family right now?
