During my career I worked for a large hospital system, multiple locally owned PT private practices as well as home care. I

completed my private practice management certificate in 2015 which was a deep dive into the business and financial management of a healthcare private practice in the US. My experience provides insight into the unique business challenges of privately owned, for profit healthcare small businesses, as well as national trends in practice acquisitions by private equity backed firms and its influence on economies of scale, employee retention and care delivery patterns.

8. Please describe why you're interested in serving on this Advisory Group.

This committee advises the County Council on issues that include regulations and policies that could impact local businesses, industry, or economic development. Access to quality healthcare, and the success of local, for profit healthcare businesses, is relevant to every employer, employee, and constituent in Whatcom County. Therefore, efforts to improve business conditions, environment and infrastructure, including that of healthcare businesses, is in everyone's best interest to support access to evidence-based, compassionate healthcare in Whatcom County. According to the Bellingham Chamber of Commerce, health care is the largest industry in Whatcom County and as such, is appropriate to have a voice on the business advisory committee. Healthcare entities are unique in that, if they accept insurance, they are largely unable to adjust their fees to accommodate changes in costs of doing business due to capped reimbursement rates by insurers. Although this is unique to healthcare businesses, the economic requirement of all businesses to have a healthy workforce is universal. As such, access to affordable, high quality healthcare in Whatcom County is of universal interest to all of its residents and business owners. A significant number of practices are going out of network with insurance carriers, selling to larger entities, or reducing client support services. This is resulting in reduced access to insurance-funded quality care, longer wait times for clients, larger out of pocket costs for consumers, and escalating challenges to healthcare providers to do business in Whatcom County. Additionally with the federal cuts in Medicare and Medicaid, there will be drastic impacts on access to care for those who receive healthcare through those programs.

Innovations for employer-based healthcare contracts have the potential for cost savings for small businesses. Housing costs and housing shortages negative impact recruiting efforts. Additionally, hospital outpatient services are being paid at 3-4 times the rate of outpatient physical therapy services simply due to contractual, rather than service, differences. That being said, PeaceHealth's mission (as I understand it) is to serve our community, and they (as well as Interfaith's Unity Care) are the majority providers for Medicaid participants, and significant providers for Medicare participants. Any action steps that can be taken to reduce the cost of doing business in Whatcom County will help healthcare entities across the board, as well as all health

care consumers in our community.

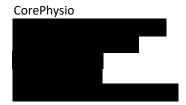
