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


Population Age 65+

Whatcom sub-county areas, 2023




Percent of Population Age 65+


Projected Older Adult Populations



Key Issues

- Interaction, relationships and connection
- Housing affordability, "right sizing" & aging in place supports
- Caregiver availability & affordability
- Brain health & aging, dementia awareness & support
- Transportation, including micro-transit
- Healthcare access

Opportunities

- Increase funding for senior centers
- Expand Whatcom County Health and Community Services' focus on aging and older adults
- Foster older adult representation and civic participation

Increase funding for senior centers

Staffing support for

- Large independent senior centers: Blaine, Lynden, Ferndale, Bellingham
- "Satellite" or small centers: Point Roberts, Sumas, Nooksack-Everson, Welcome
- New and emerging community-led groups: Kendall and Van Zandt (no County funding now)
- Increased numbers and diversity of center participants requires more varied and dynamic offerings

State and national recognition of senior centers

- Senior Center Support is a 2024 Legislative Priority of the Washington State Council on Aging
- National Council on Aging <u>affirmed commitment</u> to the vital work of senior centers

WCHCS focus on aging and older adults

Lead or contribute to prevention and intervention efforts

Social isolation

Surgeon General's advisory on the national epidemic of social isolation and loneliness

Chronic disease

- Cardiovascular disease is the #1 cause of death in Whatcom County
- Chronic diseased most prevalent among older adults

Dementia

- The World Health Organization named dementia a public health priority over a decade ago.
- Alzheimer's was the 3th leading cause of death in Whatcom County in 2020

Falls

Called an <u>urgent national public health crisis</u> by the American Public Health Association.

Older adult representation & civic participation

- Intentionally seek older adults for County boards and commissions, considering age as a dimension of diversity, equity and inclusion.
- Regard elders as resources: consider intergenerational approaches to existing work, e.g., some aspects of Healthy Children's Fund implementation.
- Designate County Council representative to the Aging Well Whatcom Steering Committee to ensure ongoing connection to aging issues.
- Explore an "aging in all polices" approach, similar to <u>Health in All Policies</u>, to evaluate policy decisions for impacts on older adults.

As of May 2024, Washington State is a member of the <u>Age-Friendly States and Communities</u> and <u>Dementia-Friendly America</u> networks.
