





Voter Registration Statistics in 2025




General Election Turnout

Property Recording Alert Service (PRAS)

The Whatcom County Auditor's Office is excited to announce the launch of the Property Recording Alert Service (PRAS). This free service is designed to enhance the monitoring of recording activity related to land records, offering residents greater transparency and insight into their property records.

PRAS provides automated email alerts to property owners when new documents are recorded under monitored names or 16-digit Assessor Parcel Numbers. Each alert includes a direct link to view the recorded document, making it easier than ever to stay informed.

Key features of PRAS:

- · Email notifications: Receive alerts when documents are recorded and indexed with your monitored information.
- Enhanced monitoring: Improved tracking of names ensures greater accuracy in record monitoring.
- Comprehensive data: Users benefit from more detailed and concise data in each notification.

Getting Started Helpful Hints - Gather the information you want to monitor:

- Individual Names Enter at least a last name to monitor and it is recommended to monitor both last name and first name. You can
 monitor name variations and include middle names or initials as additional monitored names. The search fields are exact name
 matches.
- Example Property Owner Name: Jonathan Anthony Doe
- Examples of Name Variations to Monitor: Jonathan Anthony Doe, Jonathan Doe, John Doe, John Anthony Doe, J A Doe
 Anthony Doe, J A Doe
- Business Names Enter the name you want to monitor exactly as it will appear on the document. The search field is an exact name
 match.
- 16-digit Assessor Parcel Number This number is located on your deed, property tax statement, or on the Assessor's Website here: https://www.whatcomcounty.us/177/Assessor





The number of documents recorded is affected by home prices and mortgage rates.

With higher home prices and higher interest rates, fewer people are refinancing or buying homes leading to fewer documents recorded overall.

Recording Revenue

Recording revenue comes from recording fees, copy and certified copy fees, subscription fees, and other minor fees.

In 2024, \$374,168 was collected for the General Fund.

Recording fees support a variety of services and programs, at both the county level and state level.

Substitute House Bill 1498

Effective July 27, 2025

This new law created a domestic violence co-responder program that Washington cities and counties can utilize when law enforcement responds to domestic violence calls.

The Auditor's Office has collected \$50,100 for this fund between July 27, 2025 and November 30, 2025.

Department of Licensing changed the format of renewal notices due to budget cuts.

Customers with an email address in the system now receive an electronic renewal notice and everyone else now receive a postcard reminder.

DOL and county auditors are monitoring the renewal rate with the change in notices.

Licensing Revenue 2021 - 2025

Increase of GF dollars in 2026 of \$386,500

Licensing filing fees are set by RCW 46.17.005. Filing fee increasing 1/1/2026.

Currently - the auditor's office retains \$4.50 for each registration and \$5.50 for each title issued at a licensing office.

Starting January 2026 – the auditor's office will retain \$6.00 for each registration and \$6.50 for each title issued at a licensing office.
