#### Background


- South Fork Nooksack River

  - Monitoring and data collection
  - Litter pickup and trash services










- Remote Traffic

  - 586 log jam interactions





  - 50% aware of closure



























- Survey Results: Common Comments
  - Complaints of traffic/out-of-towners and how the cleanliness of the river has changed
  - Observations of how the river itself has changed
  - Positivity
  - Recreation related observations





- Survey Results: Questions
  - Which tribes are involved in managing the upper portion of the river?
  - Will the watercraft closure ever be lifted?
  - Does swimming in the river disturb the fish?
  - Does wearing sunscreen pollute the river?
  - How big do the salmon get in this river?
  - Why is there no fishing?
  - How do we help the salmon?
  - Are there salmon in this specific spot in the river right now?
  - Is fishing open right now on the South Fork?

#### 2024 Program Results: Recommendations

- People use these properties like parks without the services that parks provide.
- Information should be more prominent where possible, including:
  - Salmon information
  - Human impacts
  - Fishing regulations
  - Relevant ordinances (and reasoning)
  - Log jam safety risks
- Trash service
- NSEA continue to run volunteer litter pickup events and support stewardship messaging
