ACTION TAKEN

ORDINANCE (2023-022) ESTABLISHING A TEMPORARY SPEED LIMIT FOR BIRCH BAY LYNDEN ROAD (AB2023-237): This ordinance authorizes a temporary speed limit be set at 35 MPH on Birch Bay Lynden Road from 1850 feet West of Berthusen Road to the Lynden City Limits, located in Sections 23, 24, 25 & 26, Township 40 North, 37 Range 2 East, WM, in coordination with WSDOT. This ordinance was introduced on April 11, 2023. **ORDINANCE (2023-023) FOR TEMPORARY INSTALLATION OF STOP SIGNS ON BIRCH BAY LYNDEN ROAD (AB2023-240):** This ordinance authorizes the installation of temporary stop signs on Birch Bay Lynden Road, eastbound and westbound at Berthusen Road located in Sections 23, 24, 25, 26, Township 40 North, Range 2 East, WM, in coordination with WSDOT. This ordinance was introduced April 11, 2023. **ORDINANCE (2023-024) AMENDING THE PROJECT BUDGET FOR THE PUBLIC SAFETY RADIO SYSTEM FUND, REQUEST NO. 3 (AB2023-264):** This ordinance amends the Public Safety Radio System Fund to add \$300,000 of expenditure authority. This ordinance was introduced on April 11, 2023. **ORDINANCE (2023-025) AUTHORIZING AN INTERFUND LOAN FOR THE PURCHASE OF FLOOD RESPONSE EQUIPMENT (AB2023-269):** This ordinance provides a loan of \$4,294,850 from the General Fund to the Emergency Management Fund to purchase additional flood response equipment. No interest will be charged on the loan and the loan will be repaid from grant proceeds upon receipt of payments from the Department of Commerce. This ordinance was introduced on April 11, 2023. **ORDINANCE (2023-026) AMENDING THE 2023 WHATCOM COUNTY BUDGET, REQUEST NO. 6, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$6,245,264 (AB2023-270):** This ordinance amends the 2023 Whatcom County Budget as follows: From the General Fund - record \$16,804 transfer-in from Behavioral Health Fund for indirect costs, appropriate \$50,000 in District Court Probation to fund additional Domestic Violence Perpetrator Opportunity for Treatment Services program from City of Bellingham funding; from the Elections Reserve Fund - appropriate \$80,000 to fund elections security improvements from grant proceeds; from the Homeless Housing Fund - appropriate \$464,359 to fund increase in Commerce Consolidated Housing Grant program, re-appropriate \$912,460 to fund Emergency Solutions - Housing Grant program; from the Behavioral Health Program Fund - appropriate \$72,631 to fund Alternative Response Team (ART) staffing increase, record Behavioral Health labor pool adjustment for new ART position, appropriate \$16,804 to fund transfer-out to cover indirect costs, appropriate \$62,000 to fund increase for ART Pilot Program from City of Bellingham pass-through grant proceeds; from the Countywide Emergency Medical Services Fund - re-appropriate \$120,400 to fund Firefighter recruiting/hiring costs associated with replacement of personnel transferred to the 5th Paramedic Unit, re-appropriate \$61,760 to fund Fire District #5 (Pt Roberts) Basic Life Support services allocation; from the Ferry Fare Capital Surcharge Fund - re-appropriate \$25,000 to fund PSE study to determine feasibility of supplying charging power for an electric ferry at the ferry terminals; from the Emergency Management Fund - appropriate \$4,294,850 to fund Emergency Rapid Response Grant program projects as a result of the November 2021 flood; from the Public Utilities Improvement Fund - appropriate \$45,000 to fund Williamson Way water damage repair. This ordinance was introduced on April 11, 2023.

ACTION PROPOSED (INTRODUCED)

The Whatcom County Council will consider adopting and may amend the following at its 6 p.m. meeting on May 9, 2023, or at a later date: **ORDINANCE AMENDING THE 2023 WHATCOM COUNTY BUDGET, REQUEST NO. 7, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,890,144 (AB2023-298):** This ordinance amends the 2023 Whatcom County Budget as follows: From the Behavioral Health Program Fund - appropriate \$113,000 to fund transfer to support Way Station Project; from the Countywide Emergency Medical Services Fund - appropriate \$76,208 to fund 2023 paramedic training; from the American Rescue Plan Act Fund - appropriate \$110,936 to fund Laurel & Forest Street (Childcare from grant proceeds); from the Public Utilities Improvement Fund - appropriate \$2,580,000 to fund transfer to support Way Station Project. This ordinance was introduced on April 25, 2023. **ORDINANCE AMENDING THE PROJECT BUDGET FOR THE WAY STATION PROJECT FUND, REQUEST NO. 2 (AB2023-299):** This ordinance amends the project budget for the Way Station Project Fund to appropriate \$5,844,751 to fund additional remodeling and improvements, for a total project budget of \$13,937,461. This ordinance was introduced on April 25, 2023.

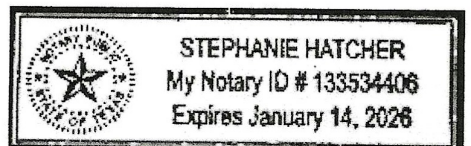
