ADO

Associate Development Organization

The Port of Bellingham is the designated ADO, the economic development agency for the region.

As the ADO we are one of 37 ADOs that report directly to the Washington State Department of Commerce.

- We provide Business Assistance
 - Follow up on State Commerce leads
 - Responsible for reporting on a quarterly basis
- We receive partial funding from the state as the designated ADO

RER

Retention

- Provide assistance for businesses to expand (Farm to Table model).
- Revolving Loan Fund is a tool that enabled many of our local businesses to expand and add jobs.
