32 33 34	WHEREAS, Whatcom County seeks to ensure equal opportunity for engagement in County advisory bodies to all individuals living in the county; and
35 36 37 38	WHEREAS, County Code 2.03.100 currently requires a person be both a registered voter and U.S. citizen to participate in advisory bodies prohibiting interested individuals who otherwise meet the qualifications outlined in an advisory body's enabling ordinance, resolution, or interlocal agreement from civically engaging in these spaces; and

50 51	WHEREAS, the Whatcom County Council recommends any proposed, amended, updated, or adopted ordinances, resolutions, and interlocal agreements establishing and

sity and Inclusion; sed, amended, stablishing and enabling advisory bodies should remove language referencing any requirements for a person to be a registered voter and/or U.S. citizen in order to participate in advisory bodies; and

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WHEREAS, the Whatcom County Council encourages the Executive to establish policies consistent with this ordinance for all Executive appointed advisory bodies; and

WHEREAS, language in WCC 2.03 addresses term limits of various County advisory bodies; and

WHEREAS, mid-year appointments to vacancies may result in terms shorter than the advisory body's designated term length, because term end dates must fall on January 31 of a given year, causing confusion about whether those terms are full or partial terms for the purpose of calculating term limits; and

WHEREAS, many County advisory bodies include members who are designated by their own agencies to represent their particular agency, jurisdiction or County department; and

WHEREAS, the County Council's intent is to allow agencies and jurisdictions to designate their own representatives to advisory bodies without restricting terms; and

WHEREAS, the term "quorum" for the purpose of holding meetings and taking action varies and is often confusing, and there is benefit to having the term defined consistently across all County advisory bodies.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Whatcom County Council that Whatcom County Code 2.03 be amended as indicated in Exhibit A to this ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the Whatcom County Council that the County Council shall have the right to waive citizenship and/or qualified registered voter requirements when appointing participants to any Whatcom County advisory bodies; and

BE IT FINALLY ORDAINED by the Whatcom County Council that Whatcom County shall not limit or restrict the participation of people living in Whatcom County from participating in advisory bodies based on citizenship and/or voter status.

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The requirements of this chapter shall not supersede the requirements specified in the enabling ordinance, resolution, or interlocal agreement for any advisory body board, commission, or committee. (Ord. 2019-008 Exh. A).

2.03.015 Definitions.

"Advisory bodies" means all boards, committees, commissions, task forces, and other groups established by the County Council to participate in county government and functions primarily in advisory, coordinating, and/or planning capacities.

2.03.020 Terms.

A. Appointments to advisory bodies boards, committees and commissions of noncouncilmembers made by the council shall be for a term no longer than four years, unless specified differently in the enabling statuteordinance, resolution, or interlocal agreement.

B. The terms of all appointments to advisory bodies boards, committees and commissions of noncouncilmembers made by the council shall expire on January 31st of the specified year, except for those appointments made to fill an incomplete term, in which case it shall be for the balance of that term.

C. Term lengths for those members first appointed to advisory bodies boards, committees and commissions that are newly created or are returning from hiatus with a majority or more of positions vacant shall be staggered so that the terms of future members do not expire on the same date. (Ord. 2019-008 Exh. A; Ord. 2016-074 Exh. A; Ord. 2010-045 Exh. A; Ord. 2001-028 Exh. A; Ord. 95-006 Exh. A; Ord. 93-003 Attachment E (part); Res. 83-19 (part); Res. 80-13 § 1 (part)).

D. When a member is appointed mid-year, outside the annual appointment process, to a vacant position with no term end date, the member's term length will be no longer than the maximum term length allowed by the advisory body's enabling statute and will be considered a partial term.

E. When advisory body membership includes representatives of specific agencies, jurisdictions, or County departments, their assigned delegates are not required to be appointed by the County Executive or County Council and are not subject to term lengths or limits.

2.03.025 Removal.

In circumstances where the council has the authority to remove from office a member of an advisory body board, committee, or commission prior to the expiration of the board, committee or commissionadvisory body member's term of office, the council shall make such removal only upon the proper grounds specified in law. In the absence of such guidance in law, the council shall not remove a member from office without having given the member an opportunity to be heard by the council, if so requested. 2.03.030 Limited terms.

A. A member may be appointed to serve up to two consecutive four-year terms, regardless of whether that member has served a partial term of less than four years.

B. No <u>advisory bodyboard</u>, <u>commission or committee</u> member shall serve more than two consecutive full terms; however, after serving two consecutive full terms, a <u>citizen-member</u> may become eligible for reappointment to <u>the advisory bodya board</u>, <u>commission or committee</u> after a one-year period of separation from the respective board, commission or committee on which <u>they have he or she has</u> previously served.

C. Term limits do not apply to the annual appointment of Whatcom County councilmembers to various county and community <u>advisory bodies</u>boards, commissions, or committees, unless specified in the enabling ordinance. (Ord. 2019-008 Exh. A; Ord. 2010-045 Exh. A; Ord. 2001-028 Exh. A; Ord. 95-006 Exh. A; Ord. 93-003 Attachment E (part); Res. 80-13 § 2).

2.03.040 Executive's terms.

Those positions to which the county council appoints the executive to serve shall be for the executive's term of office. (Ord. 2019-008 Exh. A; Ord. 2010-045 Exh. A; Ord. 2001-028 Exh. A; Ord. 95-006 Exh. A; Ord. 93-003 Attachment E (part); Res. 80-13 § 3).

2.03.050 Appointment of noncouncilmembers to <u>advisory bodies</u> boards, commissions and committees.

For appointment by the council of noncouncilmembers to <u>advisory bodies</u> those boards, commissions and committees performing either an administrative or a legislative function, the council shall publish vacancies on its website and include an application deadline of 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday of the week prior to the regularly scheduled council meeting at which nominations and possible votes to appoint are scheduled to occur. Councilmembers shall make nominations from the list of applicants at this same regularly scheduled council meeting. Nominations for appointment to any position having a residency requirement as to council district shall be made only by the councilmembers from the district or the councilmember at large. Appointment of the nominees shall occur by an affirmative roll-call vote by a majority of the entire council. In the case of only one applicant for a given vacancy, nomination and appointment by general consent may occur. (Ord. 2019-008 Exh. A; Ord. 2014-044 Exh. A; Ord. 2010-045 Exh. A; Ord. 2001-028 Exh. 2.03.060 Appointment of planning commission members.

Councilmembers will follow the procedure set forth in WCC 2.03.050 when making nominations and appointments to the planning commission. (Ord. 2019-008 Exh. A; Ord. 2010-045 Exh. A; Ord. 2001-028 Exh. A; Ord. 95-006 Exh. A; Ord. 93-003 Attachment E (part). Formerly 2.03.065).

2.03.0760 Confirmation of executive appointments.

A. Council confirmation of executive appointments shall be handled in the following manner: The executive shall present in writing to the council office, no later than seven days before the council meeting at which action is requested, the names of his-their appointments, positions and terms to which they are to be appointed, information on the appointees' qualifications or background, and any other information the executive deems appropriate, except in the case of executive appointments to executive and administrative offices, in which case this information shall include a job description and a resume. This information shall also be made available upon request to the public.

B. The council shall confirm or reject appointments by the county executive within 30 days of the date the names are submitted to it; failure to act within this time period shall cause the appointees to be deemed confirmed. Confirmation or rejection shall be by an affirmative vote by a majority of the entire council. (Ord. 2019-008 Exh. A; Ord. 2010-045 Exh. A; Ord. 2001-028 Exh. A; Ord. 95-006 Exh. A; Ord. 93-003 Attachment E (part); Ord. 91-030 (part)).

2.03.0870 Review of nominees and executive appointees.

A. Councilmembers will individually be responsible for meeting or contacting individuals nominated to serve on an advisory body board, commission, or committee, and individuals whose appointment by the executive is scheduled for confirmation by the council, prior to the council's consideration of the nomination or request for confirmation.

B. The council chairperson may arrange for the council interview of the nominee or the recommended executive appointee prior to the regularly scheduled council meeting at which appointment or confirmation will be considered.

C. The names of recommended appointees by the executive, and the names of nominees by councilmembers, shall be published on the agenda for the council meeting at which action is to be taken in filling a position or confirming an appointment. (Ord. 2019-008 Exh. A; Ord. 2010-045 Exh. A; Ord. 2001-028 Exh. A; Ord. 95-006 Exh. A. Formerly 2.03.075).

2.03.0980 Vacancies on advisory bodies citizen boards, committees and commissions.

A. The clerk of the council shall cause to be compiled and published annually on the County website a listing of vacancies and anticipated vacancies on all advisory bodiescitizen boards, committees and commissions within the appointive jurisdiction of both the council and the executive.

B. The listing shall state the title and term of office of each position, residency if requirements to live in Whatcom County are applicable (if any), the appointing authority, and an physical address, e-mail address, and telephone number for obtaining further information or for making applications. The listing shall also include a brief description of the duties of each position and information on when the regular meetings of the body in question are held.

C. The listing shall be posted in conspicuous places in the Courthouse, provided to all county councilmembers, public libraries and city halls in the county, and be made available to the public and news media at no charge.

D. Persons expressing an interest in applying for appointment to a council-appointed position on an advisory body-board, commission or committee shall be given an application form to complete and file with the clerk, giving his or hertheir name, address, telephone number, occupation and relevant qualifications. The applications shall be kept on file in the clerk's office. An application for an advisory body is a public record subject to disclosure upon request. Once an applicant is appointed, some personal information such as residential

address, telephone number, and e-mail address may be exempted from public disclosure as allowed by RCW 42.56.250.

E. Persons expressing an interest in applying for appointment to an executive-appointed position on an advisory body-board, commission or committee shall be given an application form to complete and file with the executive's office, giving his or hertheir name, address, telephone number, occupation and relevant qualifications. The applications shall be kept on file in the executive's office. An application for an advisory body is a public record subject to disclosure upon request. Once an applicant is appointed, some personal information such as residential address, telephone number, and e-mail address may be exempted from public disclosure as allowed by RCW 42.56.250.

F. In fulfilling the obligations of this section, the clerk shall seek the cooperation of the executive and may accomplish his or hertheir obligations through joint action with the executive's office. (Ord. 2019-008 Exh. A; Ord. 2017-007 Exh. A; Ord. 2010-045 Exh. A; Ord. 2001-028 Exh. A; Ord. 95-006 Exh. A; Ord. 91-030 (part). Formerly 2.03.080).

2.03.±090 Qualifications.

A. To qualify for appointment by the council and/or executive to fill any vacancy on board, committee or commission, a person shall be a qualified registered voter and resident of the district, agency, or group he or she is appointed to represent on a specific board, committee or commission, meeting all of the qualifications of Section 4.20 of the Whatcom County Charter. To qualify for appointment on a County advisory body, a person shall live in Whatcom County and shall meet the requirements of the advisory body's enabling statute.

B. Individuals who have declared candidacy (as defined in RCW 42.17A.005(78)) for a paid elected office in any jurisdiction within the county are not eligible for appointment while he or she isthey are a candidate, but shall be eligible for: (A) appointment as the official representative of an entity he or she isthey are currently elected to, or (B) reappointment to additional terms, as allowed by the Whatcom County Code, to the same advisory body board or committee he or she wasthey were on prior to declaration of candidacy. 2.03.100 Organization - Meetings.

A. An advisory body may establish its own operating bylaws, except:

- 1. A quorum for the purpose of holding a meeting and taking action will be more than one-half of the total number of committee positions, regardless of whether any positions are vacant.
- 2. A vote to make a recommendation to the County Council and/or County Executive shall be approved by a quorum of the members as defined in (1) above.
