#### **Executive Summary**

This report presents Whatcom County's financial performance for the first nine months of 2025 (through the third quarter) compared with the same nine-month period in 2024.

At the end of the third quarter, the General Fund has collected 64.8% of its budgeted revenues and has spent 68.1% of its budgeted expenditures. Revenues increased \$464,000, or 0.5%, compared to the first nine months of 2024. The County Council approved a 9.8% increase in property taxes for 2025, generating approximately \$4.2 million in additional annual revenue, with \$2.7 million collected through the end of the third quarter. Other revenue categories experienced declines: intergovernmental revenues decreased compared to prior years, in part due to an accounting change for prepaid grant revenue, and miscellaneous revenues decreased due to an annual interest allocation adjustment that has been moved to a quarterly basis. These offsetting decreases resulted in modest year-over-year revenue growth. Expenditures are within current-year expectations and are consistent with the percentage of the budget spent during the same nine-month period in 2024. Spending has increased \$7.1 million, or 7.9%, compared to the first three quarters of 2024, primarily due to employee step increases, cost-of-living adjustments, and higher costs for contracted services.

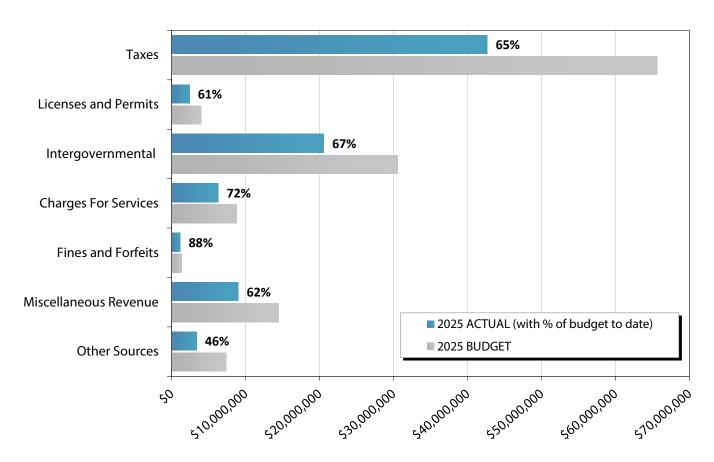
While sales tax revenues show modest overall growth of 1.7% for the first nine months of 2025, the underlying trend is concerning. Collections from November and December 2024 sales (distributed in January and February 2025) totaled \$4.0 million compared to \$3.4 million from the same period in the prior year—growth of \$600,000. However, collections for January through October sales show a decline, with 2025 totaling \$19.0 million compared to \$19.3 million in 2024. This concentration of growth in just two months, followed by flat or declining performance in subsequent months, suggests the overall economy may be softening. New sales taxes were implemented, with the first receipts expected in December 2025; however, the revenue impact remains uncertain. The County will closely monitor these trends and adjust discretionary 2026 spending as needed, pending clearer revenue patterns.

The current estimated 2025 General Fund ending fund balance is projected to be approximately \$29.7 million. This projection includes recognizing \$2.7 million of Local Assistance and Tribal Consistency Funds in 2025 operations, which were previously deferred for recognition in the 2025-2026 two-year budget period. The projection also assumes an estimated budget lapse of \$12.9 million (approved spending that will not be used by year-end), which is conservative compared to the actual 2024 budget lapse of \$14.7 million.

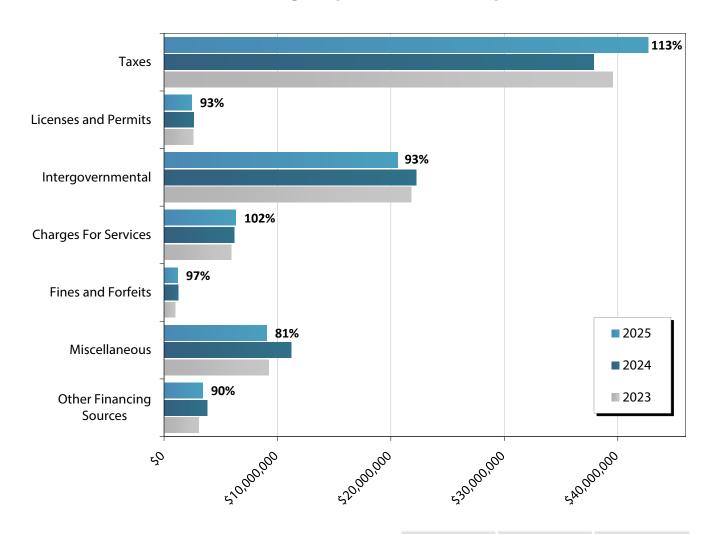

#### **General Fund Revenue Notes**

#### **Taxes**

Property tax and retail sales tax make up 96.1% of Whatcom County's tax revenue budget; the remaining 3.9% is composed of Enhanced 911 (E911) taxes passed through to the City of Bellingham's emergency dispatch center and a much smaller amount of excise and gambling taxes.

Overall taxes increased \$4,778,365, or 12.6%, compared to the first nine months of 2024. The County Council approved a 9.8% increase in property taxes for 2025, generating approximately \$4.2 million in additional annual revenue. New construction and increases in personal property and state utility valuations should add another \$800,000 to 2025 collections. Current property tax collections are up \$2.7 million, or 14.3%, compared to the same period in 2024.

Current year sales tax collections show modest growth of 1.7%, or \$316,459, compared to the first nine months of 2024. A significant accounting change in 2025 affects Enhanced 911 (E911) tax reporting. Whatcom County collects these taxes and passes them through to the City of Bellingham for emergency dispatch services. Previously, these taxes bypassed the General Fund and were distributed directly from the Treasurer's Suspense Fund. The State Auditor now requires the County to record E911 taxes as General Fund revenue before distributing them to the City. Revenues through the third quarter include \$1.7 million of E911 taxes.

#### **Licenses & Permits**

Building permits account for 39.8% of the Licenses & Permits budget. Health & Community Services' restaurant, food-handling, on-site septic, and other miscellaneous health-related licenses and permits make up 37.9% of the budget. Cable franchise fee revenues are 18.4%, and marriage licenses, firearm permits, well permits, and fire control permits account for the remaining 3.9%.

License and Permit Fees decreased \$180,885, or 6.9%, compared to the first nine months of 2024. Building permits remained relatively flat with an increase of \$5,400. Health & Community Services' restaurant, food handler, and living environment permits decreased \$109,000, or 14.3%, primarily due to reduced demand coinciding with 30%-47% declines in vehicle border traffic. On-site sewage permits also decreased \$44,750, or 15.9%. Franchise fees and royalties have been declining steadily over the past few years as customers switch from cable TV to other services, down \$22,600 compared to 2024. Firearms permits in the Sheriff's Office decreased \$14,000, or 17.6%.

#### Intergovernmental Revenue

Intergovernmental Revenue is mainly federal and state grants, entitlements and shared revenues.

Intergovernmental Revenues decreased \$1,657,806, or 7.4%, compared to the first nine months of 2024, primarily due to an accounting procedure change designed to align revenues with expenses. Previously, the County recognized advance grant payments as revenue upon receipt, then reclassified them as liabilities if not spent by year-end. Under the new approach, advance payments are recorded as unearned revenue on the balance sheet and recognized as revenue only when they are expended in accordance with the grant restrictions. This year's variance primarily reflects \$2.7 million in federal Local Assistance and Tribal Consistency Funding and Parks FEMA funding for prior year flood damages that were previously recognized as revenue but are now held as unearned revenue until spent.

Offsetting this decrease are revenue increases from Comprehensive Plan update funds of \$330,500 and water adjudication funds of \$540,500 compared to 2024. Grant funding varies year to year based on programming

and the availability of federal, state, and local resources.

#### **Charges for Services**

Charges for Services include document recording fees (Auditor), motor vehicle license fees (Auditor), plan check fees (Planning & Development Services), adult probation fees (District Court Probation), immunizations (Health Department), fees charged to other governments for probation and law enforcement-related services, and several other miscellaneous service fees that help cover the costs of providing specific services used by individual customers.

Charges for Servicesincreased \$121,883, or 2%, compared to the first nine months of 2024. The most significant changes were in the following departments: Superior Court Clerk fee revenues increased \$100,930, or 25.4%, due to increases in state-mandated fees as well as new fees imposed on water adjudication cases. District Court fees decreased \$93,500, or 11.4%, due to the timing of probation service payments received from municipalities. Sheriff fees increased \$115,782, or 50.2%, largely due to increases in reimbursable overtime. Treasurer fees also increased \$105,700, or 22.2%, due to an increase in real estate excise tax processing fees. Planning & Development and Health & Community Services had modest decreases of \$57,000 and \$56,600, respectively.

#### **Fines and Forfeits**

Fines and Forfeits consist principally of property tax penalties, traffic infraction revenue, and misdemeanor penalties for criminal traffic offenses. It also includes bail/bond forfeitures, code enforcement fines, public defense recoupment, and other miscellaneous criminal costs and penalties.

Fines and Forfeits revenues decreased \$42,605, or 3.4%, compared to the first nine months of 2024. Traffic infraction revenues increased by \$135,548; however, penalties assessed by the Treasurer on late property taxes, filings, special assessments, and real estate excise taxes decreased by \$132,377. Court-related penalties and cost recoupments have been declining steadily in recent years, accounting for the additional \$45,776 decrease.

#### Miscellaneous

Miscellaneous revenues are made up of delinquent property tax interest earnings, investment interest earnings, rents, contributions, refunds, judgments and settlements, and various small, otherwise unclassified, amounts.

Miscellaneous revenues decreased \$2,164,567, or 19.3%, compared to the first nine months of 2024. Investment earnings increased \$855,000; however, a change in accounting to more accurately reflect the amount actually belonging to the General Fund resulted in an approximately \$2 million distribution to other funds. In past years, interest earnings due to other funds were held in the General Fund until year-end adjustments were made. This year, as of the end of the third quarter and moving forward, adjustments will be made at least quarterly.

Other significant variances in this category include property tax interest, which increased \$1.4 million, principally due to an appeals settlement with a large commercial taxpayer. Judgments and settlements decreased by \$2.4 million because the opioid and vape settlement funds received last year are now recorded as unearned revenue on the balance sheet until the spending restrictions are met.

#### **Other Financing Sources**

The Other Financing Sources revenue budget is composed of state timber revenues (0.7%) and transfers from other Whatcom County funds (99.3%).

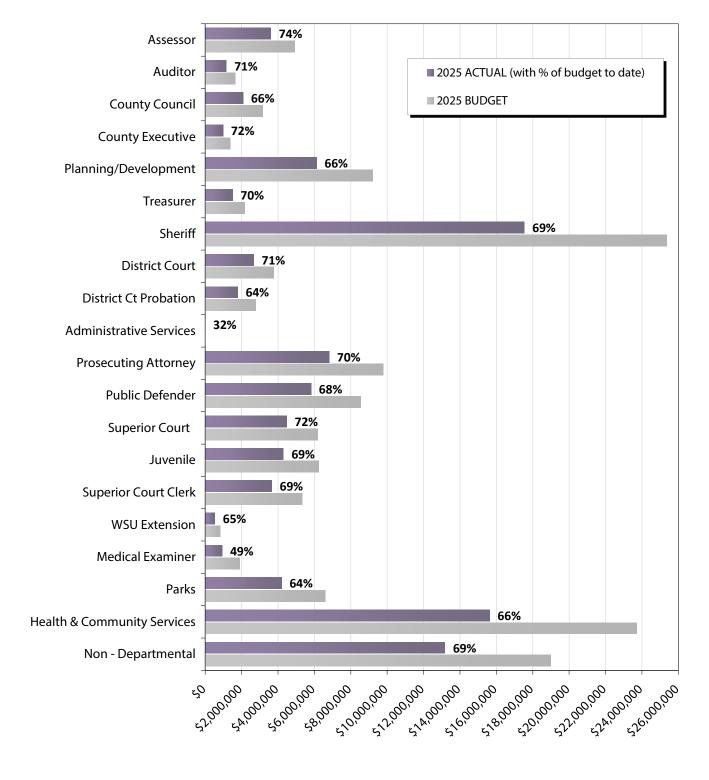
The Other Financing Sources category decreased \$390,421, or 10.3%, compared to the first nine months of 2024. The favorable variances in this category are the result of increased Current Expense allocations in the 2025-2026 two-year budget period compared to the amounts allocated in the prior budget period. This increase amounts to \$490,720 more collected this year compared to 2024.

The other significant variance, a decrease of \$856,942, is the result of interfund transfers from other departmental funds to support Health & Community Services Department administrative costs and the Nurse Family Partnership, which was not executed as of the third quarter of 2025 due to staffing turnover.

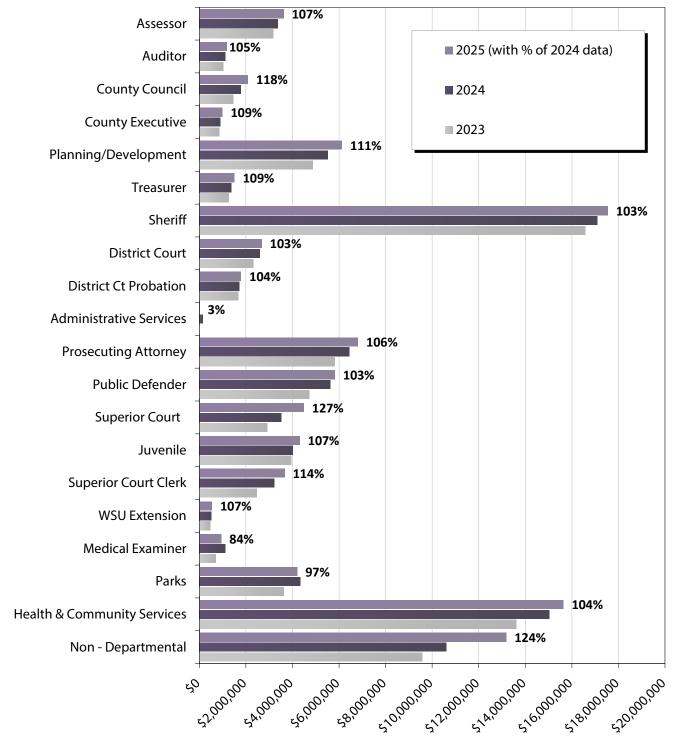

#### **General Fund Expenditure Notes**

General Fund expenditures through the third quarter were 68.1% of the approved budget, consistent with prior years. Departmental spending increased \$7,083,958, or 7.9%, compared to the first nine months of 2024. Most increased spending was due to wage and benefit increases, as well as increases for allocations of administrative services, tort funding, and building maintenance costs.

Several departments experienced notable changes in spending patterns compared to the first nine months of 2024:

Council Office increased by \$313,620, or 17.7%, over 2024, which includes the charter review process, as well as professional service contracts related to reviews of the countywide fire and emergency medical services structure and human resources policies and procedures. The Council also added a legislative coordinator during the biennial budget process.

Planning and Development Services increased \$613,940, or 11.1%, over last year, primarily due to professional services related to a Birch Bay incorporation study and work on the 2025 Comprehensive Plan update.

Administrative Services expenditures in the General Fund are relatively minor amounts for parking lot expenses. Last year also included \$144,705 for a computer upgrade on the Assessor/Treasurer System.

Superior Court expenditures increased \$963,085, or 27.4%, due to water adjudication expenses, including filling vacant positions and establishing a new courtroom.

The Superior Court Clerk also increased spending by \$447,719, or 14%, primarily due to filling vacancies in conflict counsel staffing and increases in assigned counsel contract costs.

Medical Examiner costs decreased \$182,840, or 16.4%, as last year's costs included one-time equipment expenditures. There are currently two staff vacancies in this department as well.

Parks expenditures decreased \$127,247, or 2.9%, mainly due to 2024 containing a large one-time cost for new vehicle purchases. Parks expenditures also fluctuate based on whether personnel work on park locations funded by the General Fund or charge their time to projects accounted for in capital project funds.

Non-Departmental expenditures increased \$2,644,691, or 24.4%. As mentioned in the revenue notes, a significant accounting change in 2025 affects Enhanced 911 (E911) tax reporting. This accounting change resulted in \$1.7 million in new expenditures in the Non-Departmental category. In addition, there are \$900,000 more expenditures due to increased transfers in support of the jail facility, as well as higher allocations for administrative services and grant spending.

- Note 1: Beginning fund balance for 2025 was adjusted from the 2025 Quarter 1 and Quarter 2 reports to reflect an accurate closing number. The Quarter 1 report used a projected beginning fund balance as transactions for 2024 had not fully closed.
- Note 2: LATCF have been applied to 2025 per accounting rules of eligibility. In the initial biennial budget they were comtemplated for 2026. The revenue will be reduced in technical corrections for 2026.
- Note 3: Budget lapse occurs when appropriated funds remain unspent at year-end and revert to the fund balance or budgeted amounts that were appropriated but not expended during the fiscal year. The estimated budget lapse is calculated through review of expenditure patterns and discussions with departments about their spending plans. The 2024 year-end budget lapse was \$14.7 million.
