**1. AB2019-414 DISCUSSION REGARDING PROPOSED RESOLUTION IN THE MATTER OF THE WHATCOM COUNTY SIX-YEAR TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (STIP) FOR THE YEARS 2020 THROUGH 2025**

Joe Rutan, Public Works Department, referenced and read from the staff report in the Council packet, submitted handouts (*on file*), and answered questions.

Councilmembers and staff discussed the schedule for updating the STIP and annual plan.

**2. AB2019-418 UPDATE FROM THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT ON ACTIVITIES RELATED TO HOUSING, SHELTER AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE INTERVENTION TREATMENT**

Anne Deacon, Health Department, submitted information (*on file*), referenced and read from the staff report in the Council packet, and answered questions on severe weather shelters, Substitute House Bill (SHB) 1406, and domestic violence intervention treatment.

Tyler Schroeder, Executive's Office, answered questions.

1 Councilmembers and staff discussed how to let individuals know that there is space  
2 available at a particular shelter, a potential start date for implementing the sales and use  
3 tax rebate for housing, which cities in the county are eligible for the sales tax rebate,  
4 whether the funds are bondable, and how likely treatment providers will respond to funding  
5 reimbursement for domestic violence intervention treatment services.

18 **DRAYTON HARBOR, AS REQUESTED BY THE CITY OF BLAINE**

20 Donnell Tanksley, Blaine Police Chief, Submitted handouts (on file), gave a staff  
21 report, and answered questions.

23 Bob Harriman, Borderline Bassman's Club, spoke about concerns with reducing  
24 access to hunting areas.  
25

26 Karen Frakes, Prosecutor's Office, reported on the legal exceptions that allow no  
27 shooting zones.

29 Lyle Calloway spoke about concerns with reducing access to waterfowl hunting.  
30

31 Councilmembers and presenters spoke about complaints from citizens and visitors,  
32 the reasons for applying for the no shooting zone, hunting practices, potential dangers from  
33 hunting activity, existing hunting restrictions in shoreline areas, and the possibility of  
34 creating a buffer around hunting areas.

1 Councilmembers and staff discussed the reasons for cost differences based on  
2 distance; whether or not they can define what is reasonable in a consistent way across all  
3 districts; defining what is considered a response for service; whether the Council can  
4 change the language approved by the Water Utility Coordinating Committee (WUCC);  
5 requiring water associations to be transparent about their contact information; the process  
6 for setting up a water association for a subdivision if they are denied service from an  
7 existing water association; the entire process being voluntary until something goes to  
8 Superior Court; recordings and findings; and the need to find a way to better regulate water  
9 associations.

11 **Buchanan moved** to recommend to the full Council that this is consistent with the  
12 Comprehensive Plan.
