The Whatcom County Council will hold a public hearing, consider adopting, and may amend the following at its 6 p.m. meeting on February 25, 2025, or at a later date: **ORDINANCE ADOPTING AMENDMENTS TO WHATCOM COUNTY CODE TITLES 20 & 22 TO ENACT SSB 5290 REGARDING LOCAL PROJECT REVIEW (AB2025-059)**; This ordinance adopts amendments to Whatcom County Code Titles 20 & 22 to enact SSB 5290 regarding local project review and fix some additional deficiencies in Title 22. This ordinance was introduced on January 14, 2025. **ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A REVISION TO THE UNIFIED FEE SCHEDULE (AB2025-145)**: This ordinance revises the Unified Fee Schedule to accommodate changes to the Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Ordinance and Whatcom County Code 2.27A. This ordinance was introduced on February 11, 2025. **ORDINANCE AMENDING WHATCOM COUNTY CODE 2.27A, AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES (AIS) (AB2025-147)**: This ordinance revises Whatcom County Code 2.27A, Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) to create new risk-based classes of watercraft. This ordinance was introduced on February 11, 2025.

ACTION PROPOSED (INTRODUCED)

The Whatcom County Council will consider adopting and may amend the following at its 6 p.m. meeting on February 25, 2025, or at a later date: **ORDINANCE AMENDING WHATCOM COUNTY CODE CHAPTER 2.123 FORESTRY ADVISORY COMMITTEE (AB2025-120)**: This ordinance amends Whatcom County Code 2.123 to revise the composition of committee membership, stagger membership terms, and clarify the committee's scope of work. This ordinance was introduced on February 11, 2025. **ORDINANCE ADOPTING AMENDMENTS TO WHATCOM COUNTY CODE 2.05, ONSITE SEWAGE SYSTEM REGULATIONS (AB2025-149)**: This ordinance amends Whatcom County Code 24.05, Onsite Sewage System Regulations, to adopt changes required by Washington State administrative code WAC 246-272A and to reflect onsite sewage system management best practices. This ordinance was introduced on February 11, 2025. **ORDINANCE CLOSING THE SHALLOW SHORE CULVERT RELOCATION FUND 3917 (AB2025-160)**: This ordinance closes the Shallow Shore Culvert Relocation Fund 3917 and returns the remaining funds of \$172,283.99 to the Real Estate Excise Tax II fund. This ordinance was introduced on February 11, 2025. **ORDINANCE AMENDING THE PROJECT BUDGET FOR THE NEW PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND JUSTICE FACILITY, REQUEST NO. 7 (AB2025-162)**: This ordinance appropriates an additional \$1,000,000 of expenditure authority to fund critical upcoming consultant contracts including but not limited to owner's representative services, wetland mitigation consulting, geotechnical engineering, and traffic analysis, for a new project budget of \$10,816,280. This ordinance was introduced on February 11, 2025. **ORDINANCE AMENDING THE 2025 WHATCOM COUNTY BUDGET, REQUEST NO. 2, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$4,751,265 (AB2025-164)**: This ordinance amends the 2025 Whatcom County Budget as follows: From the General Fund: appropriate \$76,500 in Council to fund Professional Services for Investigative Committee; appropriate \$12,500 in District Court to fund increases for Whatcom Dispute Resolution Center contract; appropriate \$52,509 in Executive to fund two vacant reclassified positions, companion to Supplemental #4888; appropriate \$22,500 in Health to fund recovery navigator in 2025 (Jan-July); appropriate \$72,100 in Health to fund Substance Use Disorder professional with grant proceeds; appropriate \$20,000 in Non-Departmental to fund Sustainable Connections Program with Whatcom Housing Alliance; record a decrease in appropriation of \$52,509 in Non-Departmental to fund companion for two reclassified vacancies, companion to #4887; appropriate \$47,210 in Non-Departmental to fund companion for Facilities Coordinator I, companion to #4850 and #4889; appropriate \$190,000 in Non-Departmental to fund Office of Health Study from grant proceeds. From the Emergency Management Fund: appropriate \$353,853 in Sheriff to fund community service and recovery following November 21, 2024 Weather Event from grant proceeds; appropriate \$121,500 in Sheriff to fund Bomb Cyclone 2024 Individual Assistance from grant proceeds. From the Parks Special Revenue Fund: appropriate \$290,000 to fund Hovander Homestead Park's Vision Plan. From the Homeless Housing Fund: appropriate \$679,750 to fund underspent 2024 Consolidated Homeless Grant proceeds. From the Behavioral Health Program Fund: appropriate \$81,420 to fund Overdose Data Action 2025 program from grant proceeds. From the County Road Fund: appropriate \$3,080 to fund road fund companion for ferry insurance, companion to #4872. From the Real Estate Excise Tax II Fund: appropriate \$85,000 in Parks & Recreation to fund Samish park Pedestrian Bridge Replacement; appropriate \$955,363 in Parks & Recreation to fund Van Zandt Community Hall Renovation. From the Real Estate Excise Tax I Fund: appropriate \$70,000 to fund reappropriation of Prosecuting Attorney tenant improvements. From the Public Utilities Improvement Fund: appropriate \$700,000 in Non-Departmental to fund Habitat Land acquisition; appropriate \$376,000 in Non-Departmental to fund Atwood Culvert replacement. From the Ferry System Fund: appropriate \$6,844 to fund ferry insurance increase, companion to #4873. From the Administrative Services Fund: record a labor pool request with a net \$0 expenditure in AS-Facilities Management to fund Facilities Coordinator 1 position; appropriate \$47,210 in AS-Facilities Management to fund Facilities Coordinator 1, companion to #4850 and #4890. From the Equipment Rental Fund: appropriate \$540,435 to fund Prisoner Transport. This ordinance was introduced on February 11, 2025.
