

Ferry Service

- Only road to Lummi Island
- 5 Minute crossing
- Carries 16 to 20 vehicles and up to 100 passengers
- Financial Does not meet current Level of Service
- Operating expenses: 55% From Fares, 45% From the Road Fund Only Whatcom County asset with no capital reserve fund
- Growing maintenance costs (16% increase since 2016)





Findings: Ferry District

Even a high \$.75/1000 tax rate for 20 years would leave a \$14 million shortfall with a Lummi Island only tax base. A lower 6 year countywide tax will fully fund the project.
