Key Program Activities



Investigation of notifiable conditions and infection prevention Rabies post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) and Blood Lead investigation. Syndromic Surveillance Influenza Reports Death Reconciliation (COVID)

Adult Health Clinic: Provides limited screening services and STI treatment for residents of Whatcom County who are experiencing barriers to receiving healthcare through a primary care provider

Key Program Activities



Healthcare Response Team works with healthcare partners in Skilled nursing facilities, assisted living facilities, and other healthcare congregate settings including shelters in response to MDROs and HAIs **School and Child Care Response Team** offers Sector-specific disease response to child care and k-12 school settings. Serves as Nurse Health Consultant for Child care settings that have an established agreement with the **WCHD**

Sexual Health Team Investigates STIs and offers prevention education and referral. Convenes Sexual Health Coalition and assists community partners in sexual health promotion activities.

Post Pandemic Priorities



- Robust staff training/education program
- EPIC onboarding and standardization
- Decrease response time all case investigations
- Reduced lapse in care coordination
- Completeness of race/ethnicity data
- Create standardized annual and quarterly public-facing reports
- Geographic assessment and outreach for enteric illnesses
- Offer Provider HIV PrEP Training
- Implement new HAI grant activities (train our staff for ICAR visits, fit testing support for LTCF partners)
- Expand our understanding of supply chains & ability to assist facilities in filling in the gaps of PPE/testing past WA DOH/COVID support
- Work with State and Local partners to offer STARS training for child care workers

TB Program Objectives



Early recognition and referral to TB program of suspected active TB cases

Provide clinical guidance & support for providers initiating and monitoring treatment for latent TB Timely and complete contact investigations

Provide education and expertise to community partners to support national, and state efforts to eliminate TB Accept referrals of high-risk patients to WCHD TB program for preventive and LTBI treatment

Increase community awareness and recognition of individuals at risk for TB infection & progression to disease

TB program focus for 2023



- Improve communication with the use of electronic medical records.
- Work with local providers and community partners to strengthen our partnership.
- Work with populations in our community at high risk for TB infection.

Harm Reduction Program Objectives



Provide access to low barrier testing and vaccinations.

Provide safe disposal of used sharps

Provide a safe nonjudgmental environment for clients to engage in service. Reduce the risk of overdose by providing overdose reversal medications and access to drug testing supplies such as fentanyl test strips. Lessen harm associated with drug use and related behaviors.

Reduce transmission of infectious diseases and prevention of overdose by mitigating the risks associated with drug use.

Harm reduction program focus for 2023



- Work with local providers and community agencies to strengthen our partnership.
- Incorporate additional wraparound services for the program.
- Expand outreach and prevention opportunities.
- Conduct a comprehensive assessment to understand how we can best serve our population.
