This independent study will review the structures, staffing, budgets, and service delivery of the current systems and identify opportunities


> Make recommendations for further collaboration and or consolidation. Additionally, the study will identify potential benefits and drawbacks of these

#### **Overall Approach**







#### **Preliminary Findings**

- Fire Departments operate under Title 52 (Revised Code of WA)
  - Allows autonomous operations of Fire Districts and Authorities
  - Allows for annexation and mergers
  - Allows for their own governance (Fire Commissioners)
  - Allows for finances and bonds (Can set levies without a vote with parameters)
    - Excess levies above the CAP need voter approval
    - Bonds
      - Needs super majority vote of 60%



#### **Findings for County government**

- County government has limited authority over Fire Districts
  - Coordinate regional planning
    - Land Use Planning, roadway and grade requirements
    - Fire flow and water access requirements
    - Emergency Management planning
    - Impact Fee policies
- Can coordinate needs with Communications (9-1-1)
- Regional planning (EMS Council)
  - EMS Levy
  - Current funding model
  - Sustainability



#### **Highlight Recommendations**

- While County government cannot force any consolidations, MCP has identified two District consolidations that will be identified and should be considered
- Emergency Communication Centers
- Transparency
- EMS levy financial review and EMS deployment plan
- EMS staff training initiatives
- Further county staff for building inspection (reoccurring)
- Training for the fire service
- County council increased involvement
