Affordable housing REET

Allowing counties or cities to impose a real estate excise tax for the purpose of developing affordable housing, subject to the will of the voters.

SHB 1867

If a county has not imposed the excise tax by January 1, 2027, the legislative authority of a city within that county may impose an excise tax on the purchase and sale of real property in the city at the rate up to 0.5 percent of the selling price. The proceeds of the tax must be used exclusively for the development of affordable housing. The Finance Committee passed a substitute that requires that if a county imposes the affordable housing REET after a city has done so, the county must credit against its tax for the amount of tax imposed by the city. WSAC and AWC supports the bill.

Notwithstanding existing time restrictions for registering an existing water right, filing an adjudication claim form for an adjudication filed in WRIA 1 after June 1, 2023, satisfies the statement of claim filing requirements under current law. An amended bill was passed by the committee.

The bill was unanimously voted off the House floor on February 13.

Allows cities, meeting certain criteria, to a portion of document recording fee surcharge. The bill was unanimously passed off the House floor.

Counties would be limited to deducting either the actual costs incurred, or 1 percent of the total amount collected, whichever is lower. The House passed the bill with a 57 to 39 vote.

Multiple-unit dwellings/tax

Concerning the property tax exemptions for new and rehabilitated multiple-unit dwellings in urban centers.

HB 1494

Modifies property tax exemption criteria for multi-unit housing. It maintains existing exemption periods of 8, 12, and 20 years but imposes stricter affordability requirements, particularly for 12- and 20-year exemptions, and includes provisions for covenants or deed restrictions to ensure compliance. The House passed the bill 63 to 34.

ESSB 5184 (HB 1299)

The bill limits mandatory parking requirements with certain exemptions. The Senate passed the bill off the floor with several amendments. These amendments include allowing a county to require off-street parking if the county's roads are not developed to the standards for streets; if a city or county believes the parking limitations will be unsafe, they can submit to Commerce to review to be exempt from the bill; and the bill only applies to cities with a population of over 20,000. WSAC has conerns.
