Whatcom County Council Members,

We, the voice of the Whatcom County Fire Commissioners, present our collective purpose to you. On March 13, 2024, we voted to request the Council repeal Resolution 2023-054. This decision stems from our concerns regarding the content, process, and procedures surrounding its research, drafting, and approval.

It is crucial to understand the significance of fire protection districts and regional fire authorities as distinct municipal entities, duly authorized by Title 52 RCW. These entities hold perpetual existence, specific powers, obligations, and responsibilities conferred by the citizens within their jurisdictional boundaries. Among their essential functions are determining service levels, funding mechanisms, budgeting, tax levies, hiring and oversight of fire chiefs, strategic planning, policy approval, and public representation. Our agencies have been and are still actively working collaboratively over the past several years to improve operations and efficiencies through MOUs, mergers, contracts for services, consolidations, and forming of Fire Authorities."

However, we regretfully believe Resolution 2023-054 was adopted without a full grasp of the implications and complexities of the proposed study. Moreover, the valuable insights provided by fire commissioners and chiefs during the December meeting were disregarded. As a result, numerous errors exist in the supporting documents, inaccurately portraying the current state of the fire service in Whatcom County. Additionally, there was insufficient research into potential costs associated with the study and a failure to identify a legal source of funding.

We urge the Council to acknowledge our legislatively supported and constitutionally protected duty to evaluate and manage the efficiency, operations, administration, and potential consolidations/mergers within the Whatcom County Fire Service. Therefore, we respectfully request that Resolution 2023-054 be repealed until a more collaborative process is initiated. This process must include robust engagement with elected commissioners and fire chiefs, ensuring that their expertise and perspectives are fully incorporated into any future deliberations.

In the spirit of cooperation and mutual respect, we look forward to working together toward a resolution that honors the principles of transparency, inclusivity, and effective governance.
