Background and Purpose

The county-wide Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Levy and Ordinance (2023 to 2028) was passed in November 2022 that provides funding for EMS services in Whatcom County. This agreement is aligned with the Advanced Life Support Agreement for the length of the current EMS Levy and contains elements of the Whatcom County EMS Levy Plan and Ordinance that supports Basic Life Support (BLS) Operations in three service areas for a Total Amount of \$25,035,000.

- 1. Pays Prospect Dispatch Fees for all agencies. Approximately \$2.4 mil per year. With annual inflation applied from the previous year CPI-W rates. (Six Year Approximate Total = \$14.4 mil)
- 2. Funds and maintains Centralized EMS Electronic Patient Care Records System. (Image Trend) at \$272.500 per year. with annual established inflation rates of 5% in January of each year. (Six Year Approximate Total =\$ 1.635 mil)
- Provides for an annual allocation of \$1.5 mil to offset agencies cost for operations. This allocation is equitably distributed among the 15 departments/districts. (Six Year Total = \$9.0 mil)

While the Whatcom County Executive supports this contract, it is understood that both the EMS Oversight Board (EOB) and the Finance Sub-Committee recognize these budgets will have an effect to the end fund balance over the next years. As required by the EMS levy ordinance, the EOB and EMS administration will report and update the county council on the health of the end fund balance which may require budget adjustments that maintains an end fund balance to meet the operational reserves policy.

As related to the BLS Allocation (3.) This allocation is meant to off-set costs as a reimbursement for departments/district BLS operations as per RCW 84.52.069 (5) for EMS eligible and qualified expenses.

The 2024 to 2029 Interlocal Agreements are presented to the county council for approval after months of work between Whatcom County EMS office and the Whatcom Fire Chiefs Association representing all of the Whatcom County Fire Departments/Districts.
