The Whatcom County Council adopted the following at its Merch 19, 2024, meeting: ORDINANCE (2024-016) ESTABLISHING A TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF TRUCK ROAD (AB2024-160); This ordinance temporarily closes Truck Road, from Deal Road to Mosquibu Lake Road, until a repair project, which is anticipated to last from June 2024 through the end of November 2024, is completed. This ordinance was introduced on March 5, 2024. ORDINANCE (2024-017) ESTABLISHING A PROJECT-BASED BUDGET FOR THE UNITY STREET ACQUISITION PROJECT FUND (AB2024-179); This ordinance establishes a Unity Street Acquisition Project Fund with an initial budget of \$5,250,000 to facilitate the purchase and sale agreement for the acquisition of the Unity Street parcies and tenain improvements. This ordinance was introduced on March 5, 2024. This ordinance was introduced on March 19, 2024. ORDINANCE ADOPTING AMENDMENTS TO WHATCOM COUNTY CODE SECTION 1.14, FLECTORAL PRECINCTS, WITH HEWLY ESTABLISHED VOTING PRECINCT BOUNDARIES FOR WHATCOM COUNTY (AB2024-201): This ordinance amends Whatcom County Code Section 1.14, creating precincts 403 and 702, and amending precincts 108, 113, 114, 115, 122, 128, 129, 150, 151, 303, 306, 402, 501, and 701, due to annexations in the cities of Blaine, Everson, Femdale, and Nocksack. This ordinance was introduced on March 19, 2024. ORDINANCE ADOPTING PRECINCT BOUNDARIES FOR WHATCOM COUNTY CODE TITLE 20, ZONING CODE AMENDMENTS RELATING TO ALLOWING PROPANE RELOAD, STORMENCE ADOPTING PRECINCT BOUNDARIES

ACTION PROPOSED (INTRODUCED)

The Whatcom County Council will consider adopting and may amend the following at its 6 p.m. meeting on April 9, 2024, or at a later date: ORDINANCE CALLING FOR THE ELECTION (PARTIER REVIEW COMMISSIONERS AT THE NOVEMBER 2024 GENERAL ELECTION (BAB2024-210); This ordinance, per Whatcom County Charter Section 8.11, calls for the election of a Charter Review Commission, consisting of fifteen persons, an equal number from each Council district. There shall be no filling fee nor shall three be a primary. The qualified voters of the respective districts shall vote only for candidates from their district at the general election. Candidates names shall appear on all ballots as drawn by lot. The member of the Commission who receives the greatest number of votes shall convene the Commission. The term of office shall be one year. The Commission shall meet at such times and in such places as it dems appropriate upon having given public notice. Registered voters who wish to represent their district on the 2025 Charter Review Commission must file a declaration of candidacy with the Whatcom County Auditor's Office during filing week, May 6 – 10, 2024. This ordinance was introduced on March 19, 2024.
