

ART responds to specific non-violent behavioral health 911 calls instead of law enforcement.




Connecting program actions



How does the Alternative Response Team Work?



From the months of July to December 2023, 830 calls dispatched to ART from Whatcomm 911.



Of the 830 calls dispatched to ART in 2023*

ART successfully responded to the scene 72% of the time.

Response Time and Time on Scene




On average it takes ART about 15 minutes to respond to a call from dispatch.

 ART spends an average of 45 minutes to an hour on scene with people experiencing a crisis.

The majority of community connections made by ART




are focused on housing, behavioral health support and other crisis stabilization services






ART staff can find it challenging to match people with community services due to **shortages in these service areas.**








Program Participants Served 2020-2023




2023 GRACE and LEAD Programs' Participant Demographics





Age of LEAD Participants





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




Defining our cohorts and how we calculate data...

Thanks to our amazing community partners and their willingness to engage in data sharing agreements we are able to access the following information about program participants:




At the end of each quarter, we are **identify participants** with two complete sets of data and compare them for differences.




2022 and 2023 LEAD participant data shows an impressive reduction in **EMS usage**


before and after program exit.




We are seeing an even bigger impact on high utilizers in GRACE participants' **EMS usage before** and **after program exit.**




2022 and 2023 LEAD participant data shows an impressive reduction in total jail bookings before and after program exit.



2022 and 2023 LEAD participant data shows an impressive reduction in total days spent in jail before and after program exit.



In 2023, the average number of LEAD participant interactions* with BPD went down by an average of 67%.





Program Impact Evaluation: Cost Avoidance Calculation

We calculate this total amount:

- # of jail bookings x \$55
- # of days in jail x \$ 221
- # of EMS rides x \$5,200



Then subtract this total amount:

- # of jail bookings x \$55
- # of days in jail x \$ 221
- # of EMS rides x \$5,200

Total costs accrued for 12 months directly before entry into services

Costs accrued during the


12 months after exit from services

LEAD participant data shows an **annual average 92% reduction** in potential costs associated with jail and EMS utilization.



Total estimate of potential costs avoided: \$3,184,765.00

GRACE participant data shows an **annual average 85% reduction** in potential costs associated with jail and EMS utilization.



Total estimate of potential costs avoided: \$16,436,129.00
