Enclosed for your review and signature is one (1) original of the Local Agency Agreement between the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) and Whatcom County for the Whatcom County Fish Passage Portfolio Development project, CRP No. 924006.

## **Requested Action**

Public Works respectfully requests that the County Council authorize the County Executive to enter into an agreement with WSDOT to receive federal funding for the Whatcom County Fish Passage Portfolio Development project, CRP No. 924006.

### **Background and Purpose**

The WRIA1 Salmonid Recovery Plan guides recovery of ESA listed Chinook salmon, steelhead, bull trout and other salmonids in the Nooksack River and adjacent coastal streams. One component of the plan is correcting fish passage barriers that block access to tributary, floodplain and estuarine habitats. Additionally, Whatcom County entered a Memorandum of Agreement with salmon co-managers in 2023 to guide remediation of County-owned culverts with fish passage barriers. Public Works Natural Resources and Bridge and Hydraulics have created a cross-divisional team to expedite culvert remediation. This project advances this work with site assessment and preliminary analysis of eleven (11) priority fish barrier culverts throughout Whatcom County (site map attached).

This Local Agency Agreement is required to obligate federal grant funds so that preliminary analysis can begin on this project.

#### **Funding Amount and Source**

Whatcom County has been awarded \$880,031.00 in federal funds through the FFY2022 National Culvert Removal, Replacement, and Restoration Grant Program (Culvert Aquatic Organism Passage (AOP) Program) for this project. These federal funds require a 20% local match, which brings the total project cost to \$1,100,039.00. This Local Agency Agreement obligates \$1,100,039.00 in funding (\$880,031.00 federal and \$220,008.00 local). This project is listed as Item No. 42 on the 2024 Annual Construction Program.
