21	WHEREAS, chapter 2.09 WCC, Public Defender, was most recently adopted in
22 23	Ordinance No. 2020-042 on August 5, 2020;

25	WHEREAS, in July, 2005, Washington State Law regarding the standards for public
26	defender services was expanded under RCW 10.101.030, which requires counties to adopt
27	standards that include: compensation of counsel, duties and responsibilities of counsel, case
28	load limits and types of cases, responsibility for expert witness fees and other costs
29	associated with representation, administrative expenses, support services, reports of
30	attorney activity and vouchers, training, supervision, monitoring and evaluation of
31	attorneys, substitution of attorneys or assignment of contracts, limitations on private
32	practice of contract attorneys, qualifications of attorneys, disposition of client complaints,
33	cause for termination of contract or removal of attorney, and nondiscrimination.

35 36	WHEREAS, WCC 2.09.070 currently set standards of conduct consistent with State
37	Bar association standards, but fails to specifically articulate the standards as prescribed by
38	RCW 10.101.030;

#### **EXHIBIT A**

### 2.09.070 Standards of conduct.

As standards for public defense services, Whatcom County adopts by reference the standards applied to private attorneys defending paying clients and the Standards for Public Defense Services adopted in 1989 by the Washington Defender Association and approved by the Washington State Bar Association as the standards for public defense services in Whatcom County, as required by RCW 10.101.030. . (Ord. 84-22 § 7; Ord. 82-22 § 7).

### 2.09.080 Conflict of interest.

The public defender shall notify the assigned counsel director of any conflict of interest that prevents the public defender from continuing to represent a client in any particular case, and the assigned counsel department shall, in turn, assign such cases to outside firms (Ord. 84-22 § 8; Ord. 82-22 § 8).
