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Councilmembers and staff discussed the reasons for cost differences based on distance; whether or not they can define what is reasonable in a consistent way across all districts; defining what is considered a response for service; whether the Council can change the language approved by the Water Utility Coordinating Committee (WUCC); requiring water associations to be transparent about their contact information; the process for setting up a water association for a subdivision if they are denied service from an existing water association; the entire process being voluntary until something goes to Superior Court; recordings and findings; and the need to find a way to better regulate water associations.

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Buchanan moved to recommend to the full Council that this is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan.
