1 Chapter 2.108 2 COMMISSION AGAINST ON DOMESTIC & SEXUAL VIOLENCE 3 4 Sections: 5 2.108.010 Created. 6 2.108.020 Purpose. 7 2.108.030 Functions. 8 2.108.040 Composition. 9 2.108.040 Organization – Meetings 10 2.108.050 Organization Meetings. 11 12 2.108.010 Created and Sustained. 13 The Bellingham-Whatcom County commission against domestic violence is created. 14 Commission Against Domestic Violence was created in 1998 by ordinances adopted by the 15 Bellingham City Council and the Whatcom County Council. The Whatcom County Council 16 affirms the important work of the commission, confirms the expanded scope of the 17 commission, and recognizes the commission as a joint undertaking by the City and 18 Whatcom County. As a joint undertaking between the City and Whatcom County, the 19 ongoing work of the commission will be supported through an interlocal agreement between 20 the City and Whatcom County. Additional government agencies may become parties to the 21 interlocal agreement as appropriate. The name of the commission shall be the City of Bellingham-Whatcom County Commission on Domestic & Sexual Violence. 22 23 24 2.108.020 Purpose. 25 The purpose of the commission is to provide leadership in the community's effort to reduce 26 and prevent domestic violence, address domestic and sexual violence. The purpose of the 27 commission will be further detailed in the interlocal agreement with the City of Bellingham. 28 29 2.108.030 Functions, Operation, and Composition. 30 The functions of the commission shall be:, including data collection, researching best 31 practices, development of tools, providing training, obtaining financial and other resources, 32 and advising local agencies, will be further outlined and detailed in an interlocal agreement providing for cooperation and coordination with Whatcom County. The guidelines for 33 34 operation and the specific composition of the commission will be further detailed in the 35 interlocal agreement. 36 37 A. Develop and implement a coordinated comprehensive domestic violence plan that is 38 monitored, evaluated and updated on a regular basis. 39 40 B. Promote coordination and increase collaboration of institutions, systems and services as 41 they respond to offenders, victims, children and others who have been impacted by 42 domestic violence. 43 44 C. Increase community awareness and understanding about domestic violence. 45 46 D. Serve as an advisory board to local government agencies and the community with 47 respect to domestic violence issues. 48 49 E. Develop community benchmarks for monitoring domestic violence and prepare an annual 50 report. 51 52 F. Serve as a community forum on domestic violence and create a mechanism for 53 identifying issues, concerns, needs and resources. (Ord. 98 072 § 1).

3	A. The commission shall consist of up to 28 members. The following officials shall be

40 41 42 43	B. Additional members shall be selected by the mayor and the county executive from among members of the community who have an interest in, or are impacted by, domestic violence. The mayor and county executive shall each appoint seven members to include the following	
44 45	1. One domestic violence victims service provider;	
46 47 48	2. Two human services providers, including, but not limited to, educators, victim or offender services, clergy or religious leaders and early childhood education providers;	
49 50	3. One representative of a major employer;	
51 52	4. One health care provider;	
53	5. Two representatives from the community at large.	

 C. The county executive appointment shall be subject to confirmation by a majority of the county council as per Section 3.23 of the Whatcom County Charter.

D. In selecting members of the commission the mayor and county executive shall attempt to reflect the racial, ethnic, economic and geographical diversity of the community and to ensure the participation of at least one survivor of domestic violence.

E. Terms of the nongovernment members, and of those government members selected by majority vote of designated groups, shall be four years; provided, that the terms of those nongovernment members first appointed shall be staggered so that two members shall be appointed for one year, four members shall be appointed for two years, four members shall be appointed for four years. Members may be reappointed. Members may be removed by the appointing authority. Each member shall continue to serve until a successor has been appointed. (Ord. 2008-029 Exh. A; Ord. 2005-001; Ord. 2000-041; Ord. 98-072 § 1).

2.108.050 2.108.040 Organization – Meetings.

Meetings of the commission shall be open and accessible to the public. The commission shall determine its own meeting schedule but shall meet at least once each quarter. Written records of meetings, resolutions, findings and recommendations shall be kept and such records shall be public. The commission shall adopt its own rules and procedures which shall be public record. The city and county shall provide funding for the commission as the city and county deem necessary for the commission to perform its duties. The commission shall elect a chairperson from among its members who shall preside at its meetings. (Ord. 98-072 \S 1).
