RE: Vacant position on Whatcom Forestry Advisory Committee

Dear Councilman Donovan:

As you may be aware, Sierra Pacific is a family-owned company in the forest products business. We own forestland and manufacturing facilities throughout the Pacific Northwest, with local operations based in Burlington, Washington. I am the District Manager for our north Puget Sound area, which includes approximately 38,000 acres of highly productive land in the foothills of Whatcom County. As such, we are the largest single private landowner in Whatcom County. Our state-of-the-art dimension sawmill in Burlington, built in 2006, sources raw materials from public and private landowners throughout Whatcom County and we are the closest market for many log sorts grown by Whatcom landowners. Many of the 230 full time employees at the sawmill and a large proportion of our contract workforce are Whatcom residents. As such, Sierra Pacific has an interest in seeing Whatcom County develop sound policy regarding forestry, land management, and the protection of public resources.

It is my understanding that the Commercial Forest Landowner position is vacant and I would like to be considered for membership on the Forestry Advisory Committee (FAC). Earlier this year I met with County Executive Sidhu and other County staff regarding the residency requirements for Committee members, which for many years has presented a barrier to participation by any of the largest forestland owners, none of which are Whatcom residents. It is also my understanding from Joshua Fleishmann that the Council has discretion to appoint Skagit County residents under WCC 2.123.040 in light of this situation.

I believe that my experience would be valuable to the FAC and to the council. A resume detailing my background, list of professional references, and application are attached to this letter. Please feel free to reach me by email with any questions.
