My primary areas of interest and expertise are in working with people with chronic severe mental illness in an inpatient setting and increasing access to mental health services through integrated behavioral health in primary care. While completing my MSN from Seattle University, I worked as an RN at Skagit Valley Hospital's inpatient psychiatric unit and, briefly, at Skagit County Crisis Center. Through my work as a nurse, I have gained a strong working knowledge of the health and social services available in our county and direct experience working with individuals reliant on these services. I am a proud member of Bellingham's LGBTQIA+ community. I hold a BA in History and Science from Harvard University.

Please describe why you're interested in serving on this board or commission	I want to join the public health advisory board so that I may draw on my professional experience as a psychiatric nurse practitioner in Whatcom County to help craft new and support existing practical, evidence-based solutions to the myriad of health challenges that face our community. I am keenly aware that our county's hospital, health agencies, and clinics are stretched thin, making it difficult for patients to find timely and appropriate care. I worry about this already strained system unraveling further should another public health crisis, like the COVID-19 pandemic, arise. This care shortage is particularly pronounced for mental health and substance abuse services with publicly funded agencies increasingly having to close their doors to new patients. Homelessness, poverty, and prison recidivism further compound the health challenges of the most vulnerable in our community, particularly among individuals with severe mental illness with whom I work. I am heartened by the strides the county has made to address these social determinants of health and the growing healthcare shortage through programs like GRACE and LEAD and with the recently built/expanded Crisis Stabilization Center. I want to be a part of continuing and expanding these efforts to meet the very real health needs of our community. In closing, it would be an honor to join the Public Health Advisory Board so that I may work with my fellow community members to guide our public health system toward greater responsiveness, resiliency, and equity.
