ACTION TAKEN

The Whatcom County Council adopted the following at its Merro 7, 2023, meeting: ORDINANCE (2023-003) UP-DATING WHATCOM COUNTY CODE (WCC) 12.36, LOAD LIMITS, AND REPEALING WCC 10.30, PERMANENT WEIGHT LIMITATIONS (AB2023-122): This ordinance amends Whatcom County Codes 12.36 and repeals Whatcom County Code 13.03 related to load limits on county roads and bridges to clarify administrative functions. This ordinance was introduced February 21, 2023. ORDINANCE (2023-009) SUSPENDING WHATCOM COUNTY CODE 1.28 TO UPDATE THE CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES OPERATIONAL STANDARDS (AB2023-156): This ordinance suspends Whatcom County Code 128 for up to eleven (11) months to provide adequate time for the Law and Justice Committee and the County Council to review the correctional facilities operational standards. This ordinance was introduced on February 21, 2023.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Whatcom County Council will hold a public hearing, consider adopting, and may amend the following at its 6 p.m. meeting on March 21, 2023, or at a later date: ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE BUILDABLE LANDS REPORT (AB2022-641): This crdinance adopts the Buildable Lands Report 2022 Whatcom county Review and exhaustion Program (issued July 7, 2022, revised February 27, 2023), concluding that the review and evaluation required by the Growth Management Act (RCM 36 70A.215) has occurred, concluding that "reasonable measures" are required for the Birch Bay, Cherry Point, and Columbia Valley urban growth areas, and concluding that "reasonable measures" are not required any other lands in unincorporated Whatcom County. The Buildable Lands Report indicates that reasonable measures are also needed in the City of Bellingham and the City of Bisine. This ordinance was introduced on March 7, 2023.

ORDINANCE ADOPTING AMENDMENTS TO WHATCOM COUNTY CODE CHAPTER 16.50, COMMERCIAL PROPERTY ASSESSED CLEAN ENERGY AND RESILIENCY (C-PACER) PROGRAM (AB2023-172): This ordinance amends Whatcom County Code 16.50, Commercial Property Assessed Clean Energy and Resiliency Program to amend edinitions, clarify electronic signature language, and remove the sunset date. This ordinance was introduced on March 7, 2023.

ACTION PROPOSED (INTRODUCED)

The Whatcom County Council will consider adopting and may amend the following at its 6 p.m. meeting on March 21, 2023, or at a later date: ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2022-058 TO CHANGE THE DUE DATE OF AB2.023 - 145 THE CHILD AND FAMILY WELL-BEING TASK FORCE PHASE III REPORT (AB2023-145). This ordinance amends Ordinance No. 2022-058 to change the due date of the Child and Family Well-Being Task Force Phase III report to no later than May 2, 2023, or a later date if approved by Council by resolution. This ordinance was indicated March 7, 2023. ORDINANCE AMENDING THE PROJECT BUDGET FOR THE ACADEMY ROAD STORMWATER IM-PROVEMENTS PROJECT FUND, REQUEST NO. 3, (AB2023-149). This ordinance wanneds the roject budget for the Academy Road Stormwater Improvement Fund to add \$588,500 of expenditure authority to the current project budget of \$1,290.385, for a total amended project budget of \$1,290.385, for a lotal region of \$1,290.385, for OMMITTEE, TO REVISE MEMBERSHIP (AB2023-155): This ordinance amends Whatcom County Code 20128, Business and Commerce Advisory Committee, to revise membership to add one member from the construction industry and one additional member representing for profit business entities in any industry. This ordinance was introduced on March 7, 2023. ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A COMPOST PROCUREMENT POLICY (AB2023-166): This ordinance arounges cities and counties to procure more of the compost and finished products created mether or member and other responsible organic material wastes in order to support the economic viability of composting and increasing the likelihood that composting and other responsible organic material wastes in order to support the economic viability of composting and increasing the likelihood that composting and other responsible organic material management options are economically viable. This ordinance was introduced on March 7, 2023. ORDINANCE AMENDING THE 2023 WHATCOM COUNTY BUDGET, REQUEST NO. 4, N. 
