Our Scope of Work

 Actions and projects to advance the 16 Needs and 32 Recommendations in the Needs Assessment

• 1-3 year time frame

Scope as per the County Council Resolution passed on Feb. 21,2023

- Proposed systems and services efforts and costs
- Proposed facilities concepts for community services and costs (i.e., ideas for building size and configuration to accommodate desired activities)
- Jail facilities concept, including location and planning level costs
- Identification of county departments, community leaders, and organizations to guide implementation
- A funding approach, including elements in a proposed sales tax ballot measure



Potential Implementation Plan Projects

Increase Access to Behavioral Health Services

- Build a 23-hour Crisis Relief Center
- Establish a Behavioral Health Resource Center
- Increase capacity of effective existing programs to divert people from incarceration
- Address workforce shortages
- Explore and develop outpatient competency restoration services

Advocate with **Regional &** State **Partners for** Increased **BH** Services

- Advocate for a state waiver to allow use of Medicaid funds
- Increase access to inpatient competency restoration services
- Research feasibility and desirability of building a secure detox facility in the region

Address Housing Needs

- Ensure existing supportive housing programs are adequately staffed and equipped
- Expand the number of permanent supportive housing options
- Advocate to address "the 90-day rule"

Build a New Jail & Accessory Services

- Build a new jail
- Build a Behavioral Care Center attached to new jail

Measure Progress Toward Desired Outcomes

- Collect data to measure progress toward desired outcomes
- Develop a data dashboard
