The Whatcom County Council adopted the following at its May 9, 2023, meeting: ORDINANCE (2023-028) ESTABLISHING A TEMPORARY SPEED A B 2023 - 246 The Whatcom County Council adopted the following at its May 9, 2023, meeting: ORDINANCE (2023-028) ESTABLISHING A TEMPORARY SPEED LIMIT FOR HANNEGAN ROAD (AB2023-246): This ordinance authorizes at temporary speed limit be set at 35 MPH on Hannegan Road from Smith Road E to the Bellingham City Limits, located in Sections 32 & 33, Township 39 North, Range 3 East, WM, and Sections 4, 37 5, 8 & 9, Township 38 North, Range 3 East, WM, in coordination with WSDOT. This ordinance was introduced on April 11, 2023. This ordinance was introduced on April 25, 2023. ORDINANCE (2023-027) AUTHORIZING A REVISED \$YSTEM OF ASSESSMENT FOR DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 7 OF ASSESSMENT FOR DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 7 (RB2023-231): This ordinance adopts a revised system of assessment to provide revenue for the Drainage Improvement District No. 7. The existing method of assessment is based sollely on a relative ratio per acre per lot and does not take into consideration the greater contribution of runoff from and the greater benefit associated with conveying runoff away from a higher value asset within the District. The proposed system of assessment will be based on a combination of a relative ratio per acre (including minimum tee for lots smaller than one-acre) and a relative ratio of improvement value (per Assessor) per lot within the District. The revised system is being proposed to improve the equity of property assessments. This ordinance was introduced April 11, 2023.

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AN INTER-FUND LOAN FOR THE PURCHASE OF FLOODPLAIN LAND NEAR ACME, WA (AB2023-326): This ordinance authorizes a \$780,000 no-interest cashflow loan from the General Fund to the Conservation Futures Fund for the purchase of floodplain land near Acme, WA. This ordinance was introduced on May 9, 2023.
