From the American Rescue Plan Act Fund – appropriate \$4,300,000 to fund ARPA Transfer Out Revenue Loss from grant proceeds. From the Community Priorities Fund – record \$4,300,000 to fund Community Priorities Fund. This ordinance was introduced on November 21, 2023. ORDINANCE (2023-083) SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF WHATCOM COUNTY A PROPOSAL TO AMEND WHATCOM COUNTY CHARTER SECTION 4,30 TO EXPAND THE STANDARDS FOR CONFLICT OF INTEREST (AB2023-778): This ordinance submits a proposal to the Whatcom County Auditor for inclusion on the 2024 General Election ballot that, if approved, would amend Whatcom County Charter Section 4,30 to expand the standard for conflict(s) of interest to include language prohibiting County elected officials from holding any other public office at any level of government during their term of office. This ordinance was introduced on November 21, 2023.

ACTION PROPOSED (INTRODUCED)

The Whatcom County Council will consider adopting and may amend the following at its 6 p.m. meeting on January 9, 2024 or at a later date: ORDINANCE ADOPTING TWO-TENTHS OF ONE-PERCENT SALES AND USE TAX FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY, AND JUSTICE FACILITIES AND SERVICES, INCLUDING A NEW COUNTY JAIL, BEHAVIORAL HEALTH, SUPPORTIVE HOUSING, PUBLIC SAFETY, AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE FACILITIES AND PROGRAMS (AB2023-822): This ordinance adopts a two-tenths of one-percent sales and use tax, the proceeds of which will be deposited to the New Public Health, Safety & Justice Facilities and to be used for costs associated with public health, safety and justice facilities and services including Facility Project Fund to be used for costs associated with public health, safety, and justice facilities and services, including a new County jail, behavioral health, supportive housing, public safety, and other criminal justice facilities and services in accordance with the Justice Project Implementation Plan. This ordinance was introduced on December 5, 2023. ORDINANCE AMENDING THE 2023 WHATCOM COUNTY BUDGET, REQUEST NO. 17, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,400,000 (AB2023-840): This ordinance amends the 2023 Whatcom County budget to appropriate \$1,400,000 from the General Fund in Conservation Futures to fund the acquisition of the Nessett Farm property. This ordinance was introduced on December 5, 2023.
