The Whatcom County Council invites you to participate as a member of the Stakeholder Advisory Committee (SAC) for the Public Health, Safety, and Justice Facility Needs Assessment representing the position of Teamsters Local 231 Whatcom County Corrections Business Unit.

The Needs Assessment will focus on planning for a criminal justice system that is built to address the root causes of incarceration and designed with rehabilitation as the goal. It will prioritize community-based preventative services, invest in behavioral health services, maximize successful re-entry, and minimize recidivism. The consultant firm and its interdisciplinary team of professionals in behavioral health, criminal justice, facility design, and public outreach will lead the Needs Assessment, which will include a robust public engagement effort and guidance from the SAC.

Enclosed is an information sheet on the roles and responsibilities of SAC members. The SAC includes 36 members who will guide the development of the Needs Assessment, act as liaisons to their communities, and help develop community support. There will be approximately four (4) SAC meetings over the next five months, with additional activities to be completed independently outside of the SAC meetings. The first SAC meeting will be held the first or second week in March, and more details will be provided when available.
