## COUNCIL ACTION TAKEN

The Whatcom County Council adopted the following at its October 27, 2020 meeting:

ORDINANCE (2020-053) ADOPTING INTERIM ZONING REGULATIONS FOR THE SITING, ESTABLISHMENT, AND OPERATION OF TEMPORARY HOMELESS FACILITIES (AB2020-373): This ordinance adopts interim zoning regulations for the siting, establishment, and operation of temporary homeless facilities. This ordinance was introduced on October 13, 2020.

ORDINANCE (2020-054) AMENDING THE PROJECT BUDG ET FOR THE BIRCH BAY DRIVE PEDESTRAIN FACILITY PROJECT FUND, REQUEST NO. 6. IN THE AMOUNT OF \$841,786 (AB2020-430): This Amendment No. 6 to Ordinance 2012-050 is for the Birch Bay Drive and Pedestrian Facility Project Fund. This request increases this project based budget by \$841,786 to cover increases due to unforeseen construction, cultural and COVID issues that may arise in the remaining contract or construction engineering work. The total project budget authority will be \$15,291,786. This ordinance was introduced on October 13, 2020. ORDINANCE (2020-055)

AMENDING THE 2020 WHATCOM COUNTY BUDGET, REQUEST NO. 19, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$7,904,575 (AB2020-433): This ordinance requests funding from the General Fund: \$75,000 in Health to fund CJTA Program increase from grant proceeds; \$2,990,000 in Health to fund Covid Response from DOH Con Con CARES grant pro-ceeds; \$47,827 in Health to fund treatment services from NSASO Trueblood grant proceeds; \$264,234 in Prosecuting Attorney to fund LEAD program from HCA grant proceeds. From the Election Reserve Fund: \$19,470 to fund Student Hub Engagement Center from grant proceeds. From Behavioral Health Program 58,044 to fund additional Drug Court Case Manager position from grant proceeds.
