

**PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE** 

Whatcom County Council will have a public hearing, consider adopting, and may amend the following at its February 9, 2021, meeting, at 6 PM or at a later date:

ORDINANCE ADOPTING COUNTYWIDE PLANNING POLICIES RE-LATING TO THE REVIEW AND EVALUATION PROGRAM (ALSO KNOWN AS BUILDABLE LANDS) AND DISPUTE RESOLUTION PRO-CEDURES (AB2021-051): This orcinance adopts Countywide Planning Policies (CWPPs) relating to the Review and Evaluation Program (also known as Buildable Lands) and dispute resolution procedures. The Washington State Legislature approved ESSSB 5254 relating to the Growth Management Act's 'Review and Evaluation\* (buildable lands) program requirements in 2017. This legislation imposes now re-cuirements that Whatcom County must address, in close coordination with the cities, over the next several years (see RCW 36.70A.215). One of these requirements is to amend the CWPPs. The seven cities have concurred with the proposed CWPPs. The County Council has the final authority to adopt CWPPs. This ordinance was introduced on January 26, 2021.

ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE TEMPORARY INSTALLATION OF STOP SIGNS ON DEER TRAIL (AB2021-058): This ordinance authorizes installation of temporary stop signs on Deer Trail. Severe weather caused a fill slope failure, requiring a one lane roadway configuration with stop control at each end. This ordinance was introduced January 26, 2021.

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CLOSURE OF A PORTION OF 4TH STREET IN CUSTER, WASHINGTON RELATED TO COVID-19 ECONOMIC RELIEF (AB2021-075): This ordinance would temporarily close a portion of 4th Street in Custer, Washington, to allow Tony's Tavern to establish an outdoor seating area to be ublized until one week (seven days) after the last state or local mandate is lifted that limits the business to less than 100 percent capacity for indoor services. This ordinance was introduced on January 26, 2021,
