ACTION TAKEN

The Whatcom County Council adopted the following at its April 6, 2021, meeting: **ORDINANCE (2021-017) AMENDING WHATCOM COUNTY CODE 9.08.020, UNLAWFUL EXPOSURE, TO INCLUDE AN EXCEPTION FOR BREASTFEEDING (AB2021-184)**. This ordinance amends Whatcom County Code 9.08.020, Unlawful Exposure, to allow an exception when a parent is breastfeeding a child. Ordinance introduced March 23, 2021. **RESOLUTION (2021-012) TO SELL TAX TITLE PROPERTY BY PUBLIC AUCTION FOR NO LESS THAN \$1,877.53 (AB2021-128)**. This resolution allows, per Whatcom County Code 1.10 and on the recommendation of the Whatcom County Property Management Committee, the sale of the following tax title property as surplus: Tax parcel number 980125 312193 0000; KE. BAY NUMBER 2 SOUTH 60 FEET OF LOT 65, AS PER MAP THEREOF, RECORDED IN BOOK 9 OF PLATS, PAGE 23, WHATCOM COUNTY, WASHINGTON, SEC 25 TWN 38 RGE 1E. The parcel would be sold at public auction, following notification of adjacent property owners, for no less than \$1,877.53 (total taxes, interest, penalties and foreclosure costs). Resolution introduced March 23, 2021. **RESOLUTION (2021-013) DECLARING WHATCOM COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT INTENTION TO LEASE PROPERTY ON EMMERSON ROAD (COUNCIL ACTING AS THE WHATCOM COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT BOARD OF SUPERVISORS) (AB2021-168)**. This resolution allows the property on Emmerson Road to be leased for agricultural purposes and authorizes the Whatcom County Executive to execute a lease agreement with the highest responsible bidder that can demonstrate their ability to comply with the conditions contained in the resolution. Resolution introduced March 23, 2021. **RESOLUTION (2021-014) DECLARING WHATCOM COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT INTENTION TO LEASE PROPERTY ON DAHLBERG ROAD (COUNCIL ACTING AS THE WHATCOM COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT BOARD OF SUPERVISORS) (AB2021-169)**. This resolution allows the property on Dahlberg Road to be leased for agricultural purposes and authorizes the Whatcom County Executive to execute a lease agreement with the highest responsible bidder that can demonstrate their ability to comply with the conditions contained in the resolution. Resolution introduced March 23, 2021. **ORDINANCE (2021-018) IMPOSING AN INTERIM MORATORIUM ON THE ACCEPTANCE AND PROCESSING OF APPLICATIONS AND PERMITS FOR NEW OR EXPANDED OUTDOOR RECREATIONAL CANNABIS GROWING AND/OR PROCESSING FACILITIES (AB2021-190)**. This ordinance prohibits, on an interim basis, the filing, acceptance, or processing of new applications for conversion of land or water, new building or structure permits, or other County permits or authorizations for outdoor recreational marijuana production and/or processing facilities. The interim moratorium shall not apply to applications that were filed and determined to be complete prior to the effective date of this ordinance and vested pursuant to Washington statutes, or those for minor tenant improvement permits associated with existing, permitted facilities. This interim ordinance shall be effective for not longer than six months following its effective date, but may be renewed for one or more six-month periods if subsequent public hearings are held and findings of fact are made prior to each renewal. Ordinance introduced March 23, 2021. **ORDINANCE (2021-019) AMENDING THE 2021 WHATCOM COUNTY BUDGET, REQUEST NO. 5, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,220,565 (AB2021-173)**. This ordinance amends the 2021 Whatcom County Budget as follows: From the Countywide Emergency Medical Services Fund - appropriate \$563,821 to fund 2021 paramedic training class; from the Covid-19 Emergency Response Fund - appropriate \$300,000 for Health to fund additional motel vouchers; from the Administrative Services Fund - appropriate \$57,172 for AS-Facilities to convert contract custodians to county employee labor. Ordinance introduced March 23, 2021.

PUBLIC HEARING NOTICES

The Whatcom County Council will hold a public hearing, consider adopting, and may amend the following at its 6 p.m. meeting on April 20, 2021, or at a later date: **ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A SPEED LIMIT ON NORTHSORE ROAD (AB2021-193)**. This ordinance establishes a speed limit of 30 MPH on Northshore Road, from the intersection with Northshore Road to the easterly side of Smith Creek. Ordinance introduced April 6, 2021. **ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A SPEED LIMIT ON SEVERAL ROADS IN THE WISER LAKE AREA (AB2021-195)**. This ordinance establishes a speed limit of 25 MPH for all roads within the Plat of Wisser Lake Estates and Lockmoor Replat, including the following roads: Bartlett Lane, Brent Lane, and Aaron Place. Ordinance introduced April 6, 2021. **ORDINANCE IMPOSING AN INTERIM MORATORIUM ON THE ACCEPTANCE AND PROCESSING OF PERMIT APPLICATIONS FOR NEW OR EXPANDED RECREATIONAL CANNABIS GROWING AND/OR PROCESSING FACILITIES WHICH ARE PROPOSED TO OPERATE OUTDOORS OR IN GREENHOUSES (AB2021-230)**. This ordinance prohibits, on an interim basis, the filing, acceptance, or processing of permit applications for conversion of land or water, new building or structure permits, or other County permits or authorizations for recreational marijuana production and/or processing facilities which are proposed to operate in any of the following: (1) open or cleared ground, (2) a non-rigid greenhouse, (3) a greenhouse with rigid walls, a roof and doors, or (4) similar type greenhouse structures. The interim moratorium shall not apply to applications that were filed and determined to be complete prior to the effective date of this ordinance and vested pursuant to Washington statutes, or those for minor tenant improvement permits associated with existing, permitted facilities. For the purposes of this ordinance, a minor tenant improvement permit may include new or replaced equipment or other structural alterations that do not expand the area of the facility or change the use from previous County approvals. This interim ordinance shall be effective for not longer than six months following its effective date, but may be renewed for one or more six-month periods if subsequent public hearings are held and findings of fact are made prior to each renewal.

ACTION PROPOSED

The Whatcom County Council will consider adopting and may amend the following at its 6 p.m. meeting on April 20, 2021, or at a later date: **ORDINANCE CLOSING LAW LIBRARY/ELECTIONS REMODEL FUND 376 (AB2021-206)**. This ordinance closes the Law Library/Elections Remodel Fund 376 and remaining funds be returned to the Real Estate Excise Tax I Fund. Ordinance introduced April 6, 2021. **ORDINANCE CLOSING THE EAST WHATCOM REGIONAL RESOURCE CENTER CONSTRUCTION FUND 334 (AB2021-207)**. This ordinance closes the East Whatcom Regional Resource Center Construction Fund 334 and remaining funds be returned to the Public Utilities Improvement Fund. Ordinance introduced April 6, 2021. **ORDINANCE AMENDING 2021 WHATCOM COUNTY BUDGET, REQUEST NO. 6, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$593,944 (AB2021-215)**. This ordinance amends the 2021 Whatcom County Budget as follows: From the General Fund - appropriate \$9,140 in Parks to fund various parks' supplies from donations, appropriate \$12,963 in WSU Extension to fund increase in water resource program from Natural Resource transfer, appropriate \$255,950 in Health to fund isolation & quarantine facility costs from grant proceeds, appropriate \$19,291 in Sheriff to fund 2021 recreation boating safety program; from Countywide Emergency Medical Services Fund - appropriate \$143,000 to fund 2020 paramedic training class carryover, appropriate \$117,232 to fund Stryker equipment lease costs; from the Emergency Management Fund - appropriate \$6,094 to fund amendment to Emergency Management Performance Grant 20S program, appropriate \$20,274 to fund amendment to FFY 19 State Homeland Security Program. Ordinance introduced April 6, 2021.

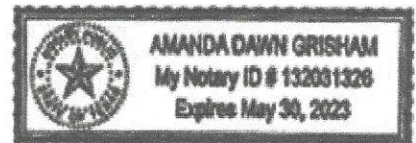
