The Whatcom County Council will hold a public hearing, consider adopting, and may amend the following at its 6 p.m. meeting on April 20, 2021, or at a later date: ORDINANCE ORDERING THE CLOSURE OF A PORTION OF MANLEY ROAD TO MOTORIZED VEHICULAR TRAFFIC (AB2021-243). This ordinance directs, subject to further consideration for re-establishing access for adjoining property owners, the closure of Manley Road to motorized vehicular traffic from approximately 0.98 miles northwesterly of Pacific Highway to the end of the Manley Road right-of-way with the condition that Manley Road residents will install ley Hoad right-of-way with the condition that Manley Hoad residents will install proper signs, vehicle and pedestrian gate, allowing pedestrian and non-motorized access along said portion of Manley Road, as approved by Whatcom County Public Works through a Revocable Encroachment Permit. The County will continue to maintain Manley Road past the gate to allow for pedestrian and bicyclist use. Ordinance introduced April 20, 2021. RESCLUTION ADOPTING THE WHATCOM COUNTY AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT (ADA) TRANSITION PLAN WITHIN THE PUBLIC RIGHTS-OF-WAY (AB2021-244). This resolution departs and massican with Disabilities Act Transition Plan within subtile selection adopts an American with Disabilities Act Transition Plan within public rights-ofway in Whatcom County. Resolution introduced April 20, 2021. ORDINANCE IMPOSING AN INTERIM MORATORIUM ON THE ACCEPTANCE AND PROCESSING OF APPLICATIONS AND PERMITS FOR NEW OR EXPANDED FACILITIES IN THE CHERRY POINT URBAN GROWTH AREA, THE PRIMARY PURPOSE OF WHICH WOULD BE THE SHIPMENT OF UNREFINED FOSSIL FUELS NOT TO BE PROCESSED AT CHERRY POINT (AB2021-227). This interim moratorium prohibits the filling, acceptance, and processing of new applications for conversion of land or water, new building or structure permits, or other County permits or authorizations in the Cherry Point Urban Growth Area for new or expanded facilities whose purpose is to facilitate the increased shipment of unrefined fossil fuels not to be processed at Cherry Point, unless the applications: 1. Were filed and complete prior to the effective date of this ordinance and vested pursuant to Washington statutes; 2. Were for building permits for remodels, maintenance, or repairs of existing structures where no increased capacity for shipping unrefined fossil fuels not to be processed at Cherry Point will result; or 3. Were necessary to protect health and safety of the community. This interim ordinance shall be effective for not longer than six months following its effective date, but may be renewed for one or more six-month periods if subsequent public hearings are held and findings of fact are made prior to each renewal. 
